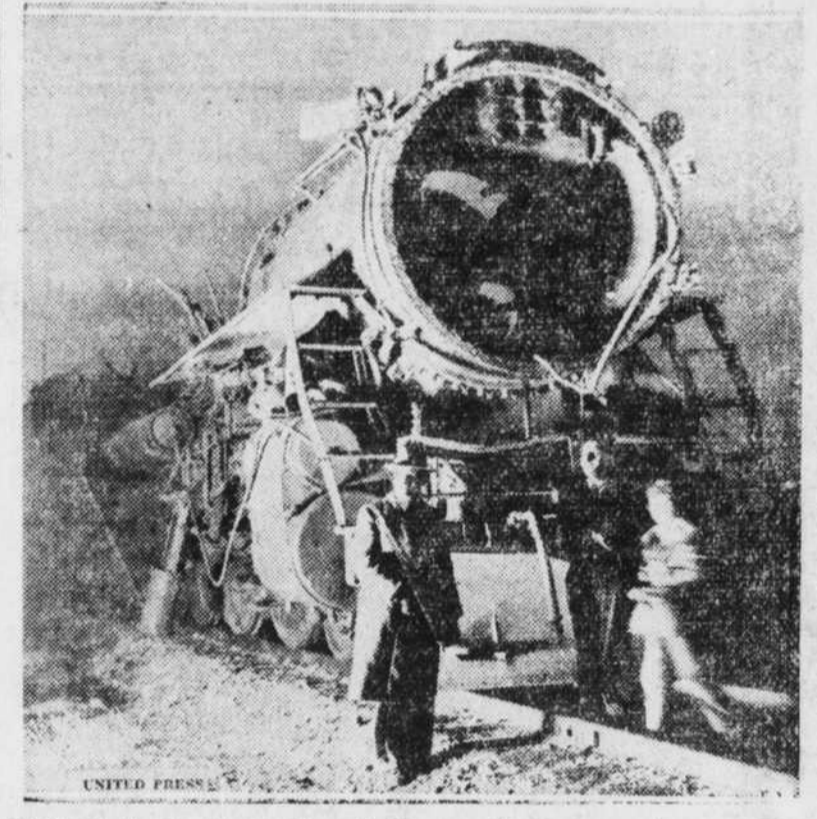
AUTO LICENSE PLATES HERE
