LONG-STEEL MAN WILL BE NEEDED

It is expected that the Six Companies, Boulder Dam contractors, will add some 600 additional, experienced long-steel tunnel miners to the forces during the month of January, according to information available in Las Vegas Saturday. These men will all be placed in driving of the diversion tunnels. Only 20-foot steel is used in the tunnel work, it is stated, and no men not experienced in its use will be employed. Those who cannot qualify for this class of work are urged not to apply for positions. A trip to the dam area by miners, except those fitted for the long steel operations, is discouraged, the advice state.

ESTIMATES ON GOVERNMENT DORMITORY TO BE COMPLETE ABOUT JAN. 15

CATHOLIC CHURCH

Jas. A. ... architect and engineer, is preparing estimates for the erection of a Roman Catholic church at Boulder City, on the block bounded by Utah and Wyoming streets and Avenue H. The church will be pure Spanish in design. The walls will be of cement blocks, and floor of concrete. The size of the church will be 24 by 62 feet, and will have pews to seat 150 people. The cost will be about \$6,000.

The government dormitory will be completed and ready for occupancy January 15, according to B. O. Siegfus, contractor. There are twenty individual quarters in the building. A large lobby with a fireplace and several bookcases, and a large porch in front and one across the rear of the lobby, are also included. There are four bathrooms in the building and two private showers. The east and west wings contain eight rooms each, large and spacious, with plenty of ventilation. The building will be heated by steam. Floors of red tile are finished with wax, highly polished.
