Greatest Accomplishment In Field Of Bacteriology Is Germ Culture Work At Northwestern University

NEW YORK, Jan. 16. (U.P.)—The greatest single accomplishment in the field of bacteriology since the days of Pasteur is the germ culture work of Prof. Arthur S. Kendall of the Northwestern University medical school, Dr. Harvey C. Rentschler told members of the New York Electrical society tonight.

Dr. Rentschler is director of research for the Westinghouse company. Professor Kendall, he said, accomplished something for which scientists have been striving earnestly for years. In the past it has been impossible to cultivate the germs of certain diseases such as small pox, influenza and measles, simply because the germs are invisible.

By giving them the proper food, Professor Kendall is able to make invisible or non-filtrable germs visible, and to cause visible ones to return to their normal, filtrable state, Dr. Rentschler explained.

Among the most noteworthy scientific accomplishments during the past year, Dr. Rentschler cited the study of cosmic rays, both as obtained naturally and by artificial means, involving the work of Dr. Bothe and Dr. Becker of the University of Giessen, Germany, who were able to obtain the rays by bombarding metallic Beryllium with alpha particles.

This discovery may have an important bearing on theories regarding the source of solar energy and the origin of our solar system.

Construction of high voltage generators through use of artificial tatic machines, which enabled Berlin scientists to obtain 18,000,000 volts from the clouds.

Construction of a gigantic burning glass two feet in diameter and made of 19 lenses, by Dr. Anderson of Mt. Wilson observatory, by means of which he expects to concentrate the sun's rays to obtain a temperature of 10,000 degrees Fahrenheit.

Production of synthetic rubber by the Dupont company. Production of liquid helium for the first time in the United States by the Bureau of Standards and the use of this in showing the existence of hydrogen atoms twice as heavy as ordinary hydrogen.

In engineering Dr. Rentschler discussed the George Washington suspension bridge over the Hudson and the erection of a 19-story building in Dallas, where all the steelwork is connected by means of arc welding.

GREEK COMEDY IS CONTINUED

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 16. (U.P.)—The 2300 year old Greek comedy, Lysistrata, played to a packed house tonight although the 55 members of its cast barely concealed yawns after 48 hours of alternating between the stage and courtroom.

The actresses and actors, headed by Nancy O'Neil, appeared in court this morning and entered another plea of "not guilty" to charges of presenting an indecent play. They were released on \$50 bail posted after their first appearance in court on the same charge.

Attorneys for the producers and cast of Lysistrata announced they would press charges of contempt of court against Captain D. MacD. Jones, millionaire vice squad leader, who arrested them a second time Thursday night in defiance of an injunction issued by the court.
