#### RECONSTRUCTION

PRESIDENT HOOVER'S Reconstruction program is now beginning to have its effect on the economic condition of the coun-

After a considerable period of wavering uncertainly the slight upward trend of business seems to have established itself as a reasonable permanent condition.

Now, we are told by the newspaper observers at Washington, the recovery has become rather stabilized. Each rising flurry is met by an onset of pessimism, to be sure, but each retreat is stopped at a point a little higher than the preceeding low.

The coming week is looked forward to with intense interest by the business world. The President's reconstruction finance corporation having been approved by congress, will just be getting into working order and within a few days should be exerting its stimulating effect on business.

Those who are indulging in a little prophesy predict that the coming week or two will see the first substantial progress toward financial recovery in the business of the country. It is said that the very fact of the existence of this great corporation with its hundreds of millions of capital ready to go to the aid of the banks of the country when necessary will so far relieve the public mind that but comparatively little aid will be necessary.

We are getting right back to what we have all said many times during the past two years—that the main trouble is in the state of mind of the people. When the majority, crossed the highway . . . beep. of the populace have confidence, they act accordingly and thereby business is good.

#### A QUESTION OF PROPRIETY

IT IS NOT so much a question of legality as of propriety which we should consider when dealing with the protests being made by those who resent the extension of city jurisdiction over territory outside the city limits.

The power of the city to impose its regulations on people who have no voice in the city government may have plenty of legal authority. The legislature may, although this point is the subject of conflicting opinions among attorneys, have power to extend the authority of the city charter over people outside the city. Yet the question arises among us common folks; if we can bring people from outside of the city into our municipal courts and fine them for offenses committed outside the city, why cannot we go a step further and levy taxees on the property of those people and sell their homes located outside the city for non-payment of city tax-

Leaving aside all those legal quibbles, it does seem unwise and unnecessary for us in Las Vegas to attempt to govern those outside. We can see nothing but trouble and discontent to arise from such a policy, whatever its legal standing.
