CIVILIAN, COP IN GUN FIGHT

CLEVELAND, O., Jan. 23. (U.P.)—A policeman and another man were wounded, the latter probably fatally, early tonight when they engaged in a gun duel in the Shaker Heights police station. The wounded officer was Patrolman George Berthold, who was shot through the arm. The other victim, unidentified, was shot through the head and was expected to die in St. Lukes hospital, where both were taken. More than ten shots were exchanged before other policemen interfered and overpowered Berthold's assailant, believed demented. It was thought he felt aggrieved at the officer for some official rebuke. According to witnesses, Berthold was standing in the station when the man walked inside and immediately started an argument. The two exchanged heated words when suddenly he whipped out a gun and began firing. The officer drew his own gun and in the exchange of shots the civilian was struck in the head. Other officers dragged the combatants apart. Officers said the civilian entered the building on the pretext of using a telephone. The gun battle attracted scores of residents of Staker Heights, Cleveland's wealthiest suburb.

ROOSEVELT IS OFFICIALLY IN RING

ALBANY, N. Y., Jan. 23. (U.P.)—For the first time since the immortal Teddy began his Bull Moose adventure, the hat of a Roosevelt was in the ring tonight and a Roosevelt was an avowed candidate for the presidency of the United States. Franklin D. Roosevelt, governor of New York, made public a letter to F. W. Tolan, secretary of the North Dakota central Democratic committee, in which he proclaimed his willingness to accept the Democratic nomination. It marked his formal entrance into the race for the nomination. In accepting the invitation to have his name entered in the North Dakota primaries, Roosevelt called upon his party to nominate candidates "who stand for progressive ideas of government, who represent no mere section, no narrow partisanship and no special class." His formal acknowledgment of candidacy was expected to add impetus to the unofficial Roosevelt-for-President drive that has been under way in twenty states. Roosevelt men are already planning a demonstration of his pre-convention strength as a fitting observance of his fiftieth birthday anniversary, January 30. What the governor's reaction will be seems problematical since he emphasized in his letter to the North
