

Planning a business expansion with the remodeling of his market, Harry Blanding yesterday announced his plans for installing a grocery department, to be managed for him by J. R. McCutcheon. MARKETS AT A GLANCE

NEW YORK, Jan. 29. (U.P.)—The Far Eastern difficulties with their potentialities as an outlet for war materials bolstered a falling stock market today and sent grain prices up several cents a bushel.

Although the war threats tended to shake confidence, they also set off a large volume of speculative buying in shares which would benefit from hostilities.

Speculative buying of this character offset the hitch in the railroad wage negotiations at Chicago, which touched off a considerable volume of selling in the railroad group. Prices as a whole worked lower during the morning but began an irregular recovery around noon that erased most of the losses before the close.

Grains developed pronounced strength near the close as rumors circulated that a cold wave over the wheat belt would seriously damage the crop if the fields were not covered with a protective coating of snow.

Obligations of the Japanese government utilities broke sharply, several selling at new lows, and Japanese yen broke more than a cent to 34.86 cents, a new low for the current movement.

Trading in stocks differed little from recent sessions, although activity rose to 1,500,000 shares, against 1,100,000 shares in the previous session. Considerable speculative selling was apparent in the early trading on the adverse Bethlehem Steel corporation earning and dividend news made public overnight, but sellers quickly covered in the afternoon when the market showed a reluctance to move lower.

The copper trade reported no new demand for the metal, but leaders like American Smelting, United States Smelting, Anaconda and Kennecott rising sharply. Bethlehem Steel recovered sharply after reaching a new low for the present shares at \$15 a share. Steel common rallied vigorously from its early low of 36 1/2 to 37 1/2 where it was off only a fraction.

New York Central, Chesapeake and Ohio, Atchison and Pennsylvania, which had been strong recently, broke sharply, many of them ending around their lows of the session on losses of a fraction to several points.

In addition to Electric Boat, other shares that would benefit from prolonged hostilities such as United Aircraft, Atlas Powder and DuPont were in demand, the two former shares rising sharply. Buying of these stocks was purely speculative, however, and was based on thin air rather than on any indications of heavy war purchases.

KANSAS CITY LIVESTOCK. KANSAS CITY, Mo., Jan. 29. (U.P.) Heavy receipts failed to shake hog and sheep prices today on the Kansas City livestock market. Cattle, with light receipts, also sold steady.

Steers and yearlings sold from \$4 to \$7 on scattered sales. Top fat hogs were down five cents to \$3.75 and the bulk of sales were steady, ranging from \$3.60 to \$3.75. Lambs sold from \$5.25 to \$6.


