Five-minute Cabbage

2 cups milk 1 quart shredded cabbage 3 tablespoons melted butter or other fat 2 tablespoons flour

Pepper Heat the milk and cook the cabbage in it for 2 minutes. Add the blended fat and flour, and the seasoning, cook rapidly for 3 or 4 minutes, and stir constantly. The cabbage retains its crispness and is delicate in flavor and color.


