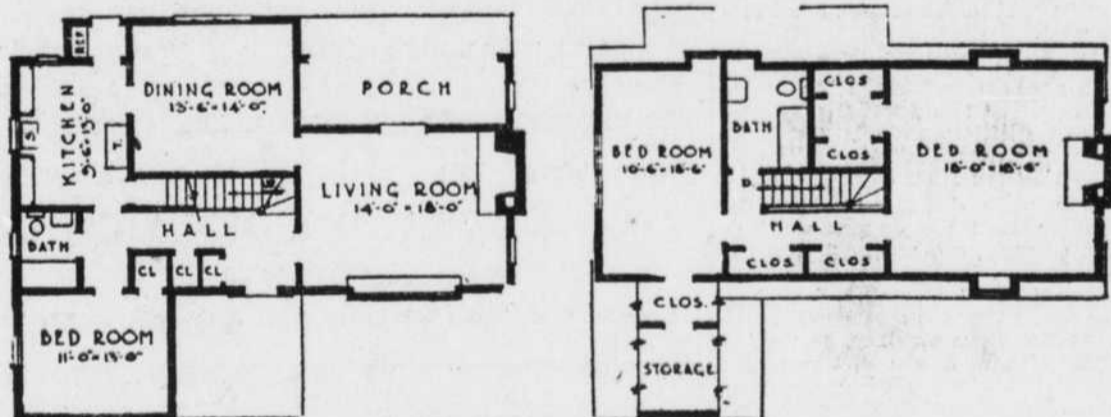
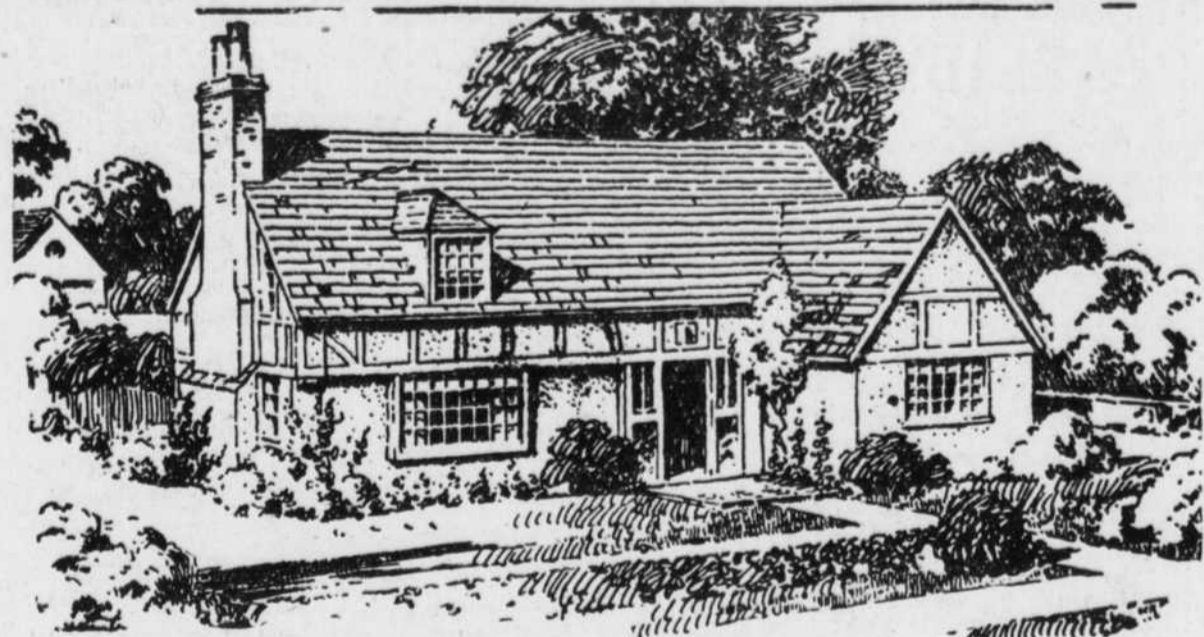

## HIGHER CEILINGS CREATE COOL AIR SPACE



The lowest point of the sloping ceilings of this home is five feet, but it is termed a bungalow type. Its Elizabethan period style is quite removed from the ordinary conception of a bungalow. The two fireplaces form a feature of the house. There is a fireplace both in the living room, and upstairs in the master bedroom. There is a bedroom with bath on the first floor, and two bedrooms with bath on the second. Closet and storage space is ample. An important item of construction is the concentration of plumbing. The panes of the metal casement windows give an attractive air to the house. The ledge of the living room window has been arranged so that flower boxes may be added. Long roof lines, combined with the wide front doorway and long window, create a spacious appearance. The plan is suitable for either a corner or an inside lot. A minimum of 60-foot frontage is necessary to place the house properly. Maximum cost in the larger cities is estimated at \$10,000 to \$12,000. It is lower in smaller communities, depending upon varying material and labor costs.

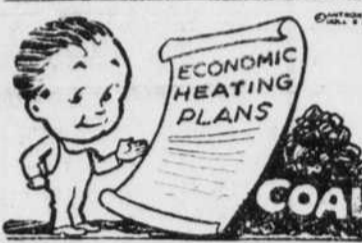

## MEN "DRAFTED" FOR RECONSTRUCTION BOARD BRING WIDE EXPERIENCE TO NATION'S TASK

Their Job Is Harnessing Credit's Golden Flow



Here are the seven men who, with one other to be appointed by President Hoover, compose the board of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation which is to direct the golden flow of credit—\$300,000,000 from the treasury, \$1,500,000,000 from investors—as to revitalize the nation's economic machinery. Couch.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 30. (P) — Men of broad business experience have been drafted by President Hoover to constitute the board of the newly organized Reconstruction Finance Corporation. There will be eight places at the directors' table. Brief sketches of the seven men named so far to assist America on the way to economic recovery are as follows:

CHARLES G. DAWES HEADS CORPORATION Charles Gates Dawes, 66-year-old head of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, first amazed official Washington when, as President McKinley's comptroller of the currency, he revolutionized bank examinations. Dawes, just out of diplomatic clothes, has a reputation for inspiring courage and confidence among big and little business men.

EUGENE L. MEYER, JR. His selection by President Hoover was seen in keeping with the President's view that reestablishment of confidence is the first objective of the government's program for economic recovery. Ex-officio member of the board is the shy, taciturn Andrew Mellon, custodian of Uncle Sam's money bags in three administrations. To the directorate of the biggest credit stabilizing venture ever undertaken by the government, he will bring the talents which enabled him to pile up one of the largest fortunes in the United States and to achieve prominence in the handling of government financial problems. In his seventy-eighth year, Mr. Mellon is the oldest member of the board. Eugene Meyer, chairman of the

Mills, undersecretary of the treasury, will bring those talents that have commended him as Andrew Mellon's first lieutenant and Herbert Hoover's adviser on fiscal questions. From a New York mansion, Harvard's classic atmosphere and a silk-stocking background, Mills went first into law and politics, attaining a legislative career of note and the solid reputation as an expert on budget, tax and tariff matters. BESTOR EXECUTIVE HEAD OF FARM LOAN BOARD In Paul H. Bestor, executive head of the federal farm loan board, the corporation will have a director declared to possess the business wisdom of a banker, the fist of a farmer and the mind of a Yale-trained school teacher. He is the author of the cooperative marketing act of Missouri. In 1922 he became president of the federal land bank of St. Louis and built it into one of the strongest in the whole farm loan system. COUCH BELIEVES IN DIRECT ACTION Harvey Couch, Arkansas farm boy, followed this success formula: Favorite sport: Work. Motto: Common sense in business. Pet hatred: Red tape. These principles, trite or not, made him a light and power magnate, then a railroad magnate, then a banker. Now he has been named a member of the board of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation. JONES IN RECONSTRUCTION ROLE IN HOME CITY Jesse Jones has been playing the role of a one-man reconstruction corporation for Houston, Tex., his home city. Now he has been named a member of the board of the national corporation. Many times a millionaire, Jones' funds have given quiet aid to more than one local industry temporarily depressed. The world knows Jones as the man who single-handedly brought the 1928 Democratic convention to Houston.

The East Side Masons Contracting Co., who sub-contracted the masonry and plastering on the government dwellings, now under construction by F. W. Riddle, have taken two additional sub-contracts, it was announced by W. W. Gilmore, foreman. The East Side has taken sub-contracts to do the masonry on the government garage at Boulder City and has also sub-contracted the plastering on the filtration plant for the Sterns-Rodger Manufacturing company. Additional men have been employed and work on the new contracts is already under way, it was said.

### DETAILS OF MISHAP TOLD

Conductor Ed Sherman, employe of Six Companies, who had his arm crushed so badly it was amputated late the same day in Boulder City hospital, was reported progressing last night. The accident occurred near Cashman's landing, fifteen minutes before Sherman was supposed to sign for duty. The crew handling the train had not yet knocked off shift and was moving the train when it broke in two sections, Sherman, while on his way to work, rushed between the cars to disconnect the air hose. Officials said he did not use the necessary "safety first" precaution, to see that another locomotive, coupled to the other end of the train, was being operated, and was pushing the train together as he stepped in between the cars. Sherman is 30 years of age and single.
