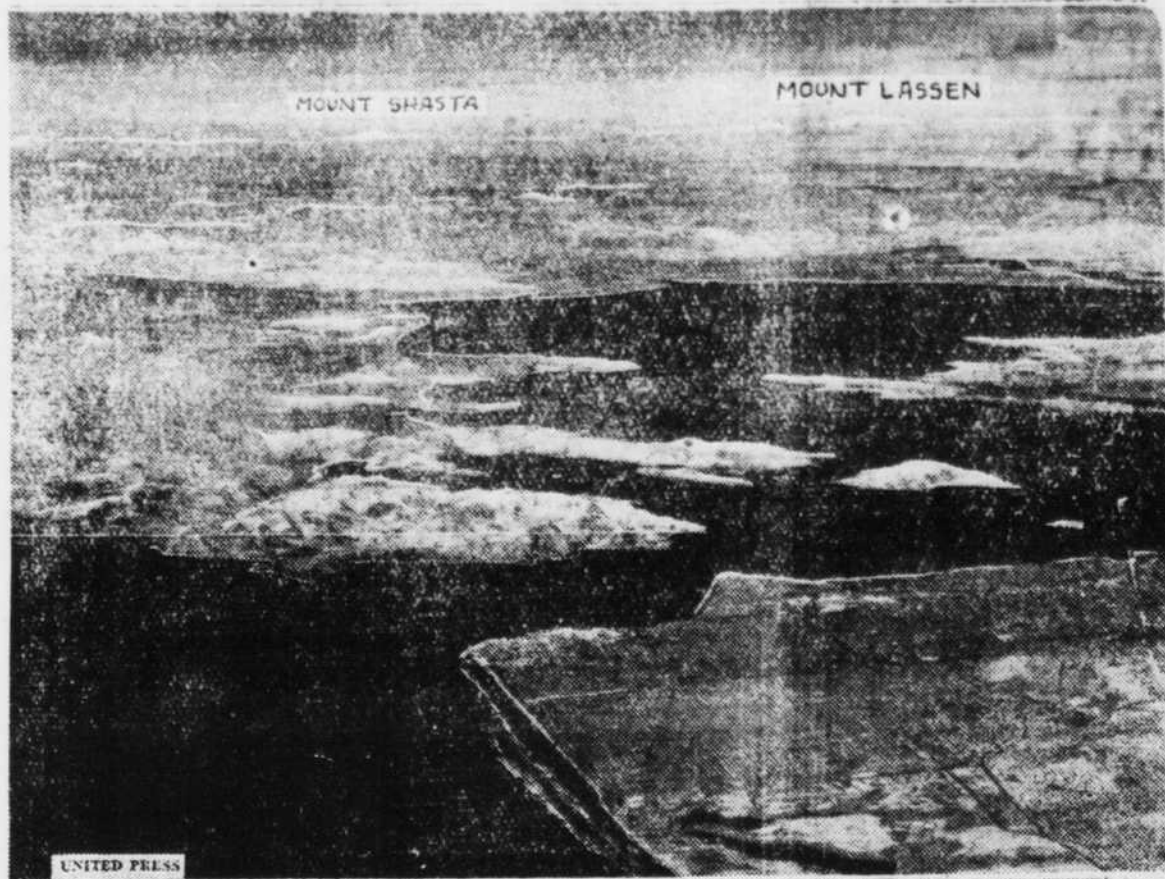
TO SEE GRANDSON

Plane Camera Spies Mountain 260 Miles Away



From San Francisco to Mount Shasta and Mount Lassen, more than 250 miles apart, was the amazing distance spanned by this special aerial camera mounted in a 15th photo section plane, commanded by Lieut. E. B. Bobzien. The picture was taken from an altitude of 20,000 feet above the Golden Gate and plainly shows Mount Shasta at the left background and Mount Lassen at right. Counting the altitude, the "shot" was 260 miles. San Francisco, Marin county and the bay district are seen in the foreground.
