HOOVER DAM PROJECT OFFERS BOULDER FOLKS 71 MILLION MEN-DAYS AS ITS PART IN AIDING JOB PROBLEM

When the Hoover dam has been completed, an average number of nearly 4.000 employes will have rolled up the stupendous number of 71,500,000 man-days worked, by the typical dam worker of 37 years of age, white, American born, and rep-

resenting every state in the Union. This almost unbel evable total, a official estimate based on the employment figures of the contractor represents the contribution made by the construction of the darn to the inemployment situation in the United States.

At the present time there are about 3,700 men employed on the Six Companies contract, which represents very nearly the maximum to be employed at any one time by Six Companies.

Almost every classification of skilled laborer, engineer and technical man will have contributed to the enormous undertaking when it is completed.




