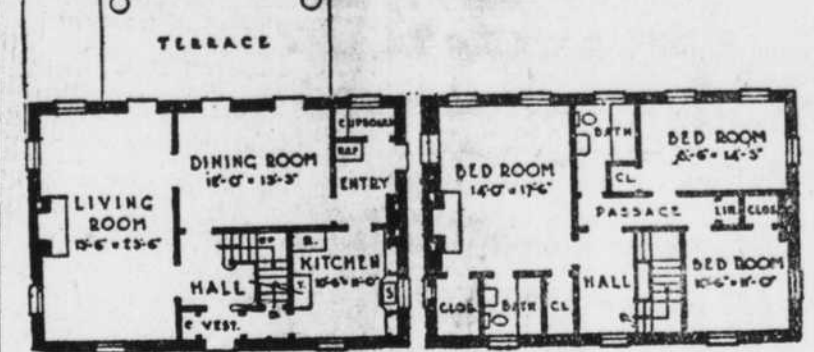

### PATRIARCH OF TAMMANY HALL DYING AFTER 102 YEARS IN MANHATTAN'S HUSTLE, HURRY

By H. ALLEN SMITH United Press Staff Correspondent NEW YORK, Feb. 6. (U.P.)—John R. Voorhis, who lived to see the machine age turn the simple world of his boyhood into a wonderland of skyscrapers and speed, died at the age of 102 today in his little red brick house on Greenwich street.

Voorhis was born early in the administration of President Andrew Jackson and his life spanned without discord an epoch of material progress unequalled in the world's history.

Outside his window, as the patriarch of Tammany hall lay dying early today, the Ninth avenue elevated trains roared a parting. They symbolized as they rushed past his window the old man's satisfaction with the new day. He had never complained about the noise of the "L."

Other men have lived to 102 and beyond, but few if any have been in the whirl of things as John R. Voorhis was. Up to the last year of his life he held public office. He served in various public capacities for 58 years. He saw the world undergo phenomenal changes. He did not object.

Before he died he read in his papers about the Sino-Japanese trouble. There was talk of war between his country and Japan. Why, John R. Voorhis was 23 years old when Commodore Perry opened up Japan—a nation unknown before that.

Voorhis was born on July 27, 1829, in Morris county, New Jersey. His parents moved to Manhattan the next year. He saw his small town sprawl out across the East river, and northward towards the Sleepy Hollow country, to become the world's greatest metropolis. When he was a child Boston and Philadelphia were bigger than New York.

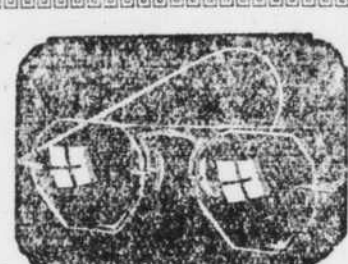
