Though the commission has made its start after Japan has consolidated its conquest of Manchuria, it is possible the members, representing as they do the principal powers, may be utilized at some future time to aid in pacification of the far more serious situation at Shanghai.

GENEVA, Feb. 8. (U.P.) - Soviet Russia is realigning local garrisons on the Manchurian frontier, it was announced today by the Russian delegation to the disarmament conference, in connection with recent reports of "war like" military activity in Siberia.

The realignment on the border of Manchuria, where Japan has extended her military control within the Soviet sphere of influence on the Chinese eastern railroad, is "for the purpose of strengthening the frontier garrisons, primarily in the Zabakaylie region," the delegation

It was emphasized that this move is for defense against the "eventual aggression" of white Russian or ezarist forces in Manchuria.
