LEGAL NOTICES

ORDINANCE No. 185 An ordinance to amend, revise, and re-enact Sections Nos. 2, 8 and 10 of Ordinance No. 111 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled, "An ordinance prohibiting the manufacture, storage or keeping, sale, offering or exposing for sale or barter, or other disposal of intoxicating liquors in the City of Las Vegas, regulating other matters pertaining thereto; providing a penalty for the violation of this ordinance, and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict therewith." approved May 5, 1925, as amended by Ordinance No. 179, and to repeal all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict therewith.

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas do ordain, as follows:

Section 1. Section 2 of said Ordinance No. 111, as amended by Section 1 of Ordinance No. 179 of the City of Las Vegas, is hereby amended, revised and re-enacted so that the same shall read as follows: "Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association or corporation to manufacture, keep or store, sell, offer or expose for sale or barter, or otherwise dispose of, except as hereinafter provided, any intoxicating liquors in the City of Las Vegas; provided, that nothing in this ordinance shall prohibit the manufacture, sale, keeping or storing of said liquors where the manufacture, sale, keeping or storing of the same is permitted by the laws of the State of Nevada or of the United States of America."

Section 2. Section 8 of said Ordinance No. 111, as amended by Section 2 of Ordinance No. 179 of the City of Las Vegas, is hereby amended, revised and re-enacted so that the same shall read as follows:

"Section 8. It shall be unlawful for any person to have upon his person or in any vehicle, any intoxicating liquors on any public street or alley, or in any public place in the City of Las Vegas."

Section 3. Section 10 of said Ordinance No. 111, as amended by Section 3 of Ordinance No. 179 of the City of Las Vegas, is hereby amended, revised and re-enacted so that the same shall read as follows:

"Section 10. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Four Hundred Ninety-nine Dollars (\$499.00), or be imprisoned in the city jail until such fine is paid at the rate of not exceeding one day for each two dollars of such fine in case such fine is not paid, or by imprisonment in the city jail not exceeding six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment."

Section 4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. Section 5. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage and adoption and publication in Las Vegas Age, a daily newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas. Section 6. The City Clerk and Clerk of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas is hereby authorized and directed to have this Ordinance No. 185 published one week (6 issues) Las Vegas Age, a daily newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas. Passed and adopted this 4th day of February, 1932.

PILGRIMAGE TO LINCOLN'S TOMB MADE BY CROWDS

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Feb. 12. (U.P.)—A veritable pilgrimage came into Springfield today to do honor to Abraham Lincoln on the 123rd anniversary of his birth.

His reconstructed tomb in Oak Ridge cemetery became the focal point of the ceremonies. There a few remaining veterans of the Grand Army of the Republic paid their homage. Reverently they laid upon the sarcophagus the wreaths which had been sent by President Hoover and Gov. Louis L. Emmerson of Illinois.

The Abraham Lincoln association held its annual dinner tonight to report progress on its project to construct an "American Appian Way" between the shrines erected at each of Lincoln's early homes in Kentucky, Indiana and Illinois.

"The governors of the three states have appointed commissions to mark this road which is destined to become the Appian way of America," said Dr. Louis A. Arren, director of the Lincoln historical research foundation, Fort Wayne, Ind. "It will not be a war road, however, but a highway dedicated to peace and good will."

"Ever since the news of Lincoln's death was flashed over the country, there has been a constantly increasing company of citizens who have found their way to the Lincoln homesites at Hodgenville, Ky., where he was born at the Indiana site where he lived for 14 years and where his 'angel mother' was buried, and at Springfield, where he attained national distinction.

"The trails between his three homes have become a beaten path and we now propose to memorialize these humble, human aspects of Lincoln's early life by constructing the Lincoln memorial way from his cradle to his grave."

KANSAS CITY LIVESTOCK KANSAS CITY, Mo., Feb. 12. (U.P.)—Hogs and cattle sold steady today on the Kansas City livestock market, while sheep, with receipts light, were ten cents higher.

Steers and yearlings ranged from \$4.50 to \$6.50. Top fat hogs were at \$3.90 and the bulk of sales ranged from \$3.75 to \$3.85. Lambs sold from \$5 to \$5.85.

Thomas F. McMahon, president of the Textile union, told the labor committee that suffering among the unemployed constitutes a "plague worse than war."

Rep. Beach, Dem., N. Y., introduced resolutions calling for congressional investigation of lawlessness in Kentucky coal regions.
