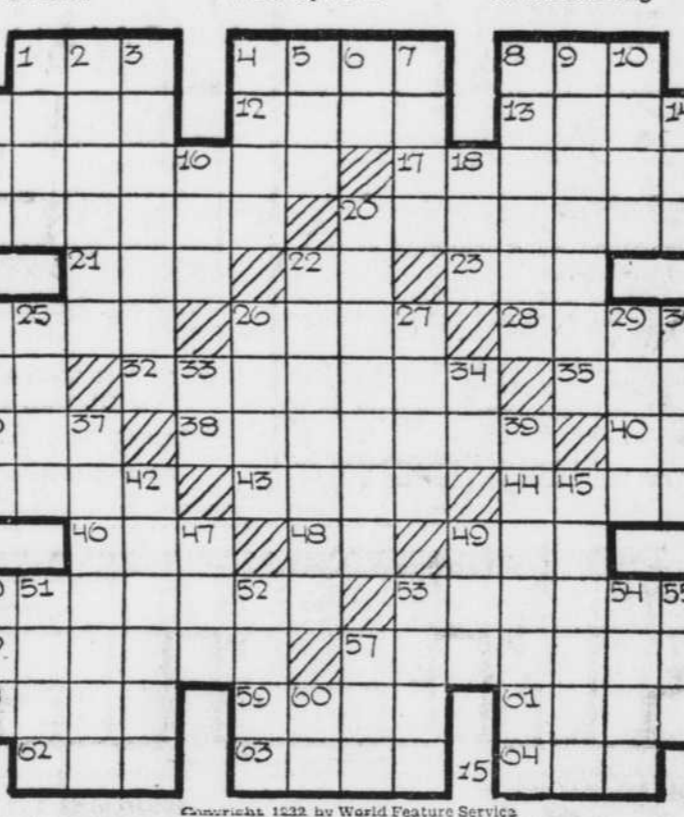

MARKETS AT A GLANCE

NEW YORK, Feb. 18. (UP)—Further frantic coverings by shorts sent the stock market higher at the close today, an advance that continued on the San Francisco market long after the local market finished trading at 3 p. m.

The new advance in stocks developed suddenly and was brought about by reports of new plans of the stock exchange to curb short selling. This would be accomplished by refusing to allow margins to lend stocks carried on margin for them for short selling purposes without the specific permission of the owner. The report subsequently was confirmed by the exchange. It becomes effective on April 1.

United States Steel on the New York market rose 2 points to 49 1/2 and later ran up to 51 on the San Francisco market. Similar gains were made in other issues, some reaching new highs for the year, several points above the closing New York prices.

Price movements were erratic through the morning dealings but when the market as a whole showed no tendency to resume yesterday's reaction a buying movement quickly got under way. Closing prices showed gains of from 1 to 4 points.

Early weakness in railroad shares threatened for a time to send the market into another slip. Southern Pacific opened 8 points lower on overnight omission of its \$4 annual common dividend and other rails were safe. The influence was partly offset by unexpected reductions of the Bank of England discount rate from 6 to 5 per cent which sent stocks at London soaring sensationally.

The London bank rate was interpreted as an indication that a reduction would be made in the local rate after the close today as another step in business-aid plans by means of easier credit.

This belief helped the stock market and sent United States government bonds higher but no change was made in the New York rate when directors met. The London reduction, however, did result in similar moves by the central banks of Norway and Sweden, whose financial policies are closely influenced by England.

Leaders in the late recovery of stocks were such pivotal shares as United States Steel, American Telephone, American Can and Allied Chemical, which came within striking distance of their highs of early this week. Bulls were expected to make an early attempt to push the market through these levels on the theory a new high would attract a large public following.

New pool operations were resumed in low priced issues like A. M. Byers, Vanadium, Gillette and the American Woolen common and preferred. Indications that a new group was working in Socony-Vacuum were afforded by a sale of 25,000 shares of the stock at 10, a gain of 1/2 point. Other oils were steady.

Recent economic developments, notably the administration's campaign and the Glass-Steagall credit expansion bill, were believed to have vastly changed the outlook and most of the larger traders continued to favor the constructive side of the market for the first time since the "moratorium rally" of last summer. Ability of the market to return to normal today and still advance was also considered significant.

Turnover was approximately 1,700,000 shares, against 2,000,000 shares in the preceding session. Outside markets kept pace with stocks and many government obligations reached new highs for the year. Wheat advanced more than a cent a bushel and cotton rose more than 50 cents a bale. Corresponding improvement occurred in minor commodity markets.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Feb. 18. (UP)—Trade was slow in the cattle market here today, with supply moderate and quality medium to plain. Low priced killers were fully steady.

Most steers and yearlings sold around \$4.50 to \$6.50, with tops at \$8. Calves were unchanged, quotable around \$6 to \$7. Most stocker and feeder sales were around \$3.50 to \$5.25, with lightweights as much as a dollar higher.

Top fat hogs brought \$3.95 in a steady market, with the bulk of sales at \$3.75 to \$3.85.

Trade was slow in the sheep department, prices steady to lower. Receipts were only moderate. Best fat lambs were quotable around \$5.50 to \$6.35.
