

NAUGHTY MUCKERS ARE WHIPPED, 29-23 HERE BY TITLE-BOUND CATS

Las Vegas Five Triumphs Over Strongest Of Foes

Though, fast and carefully played ball game last night in which Las Vegas Wildcats trounced Tonopah Muckers by a 29-23 marked another successful in the Wildcats' attempt to themselves back in the race for the state basketball crown.

The game was close all the way and both teams showed a defense that was hard to penetrate. Wildcats, led by Capt. Tonopah offense was much more depended more on the one-handed shots of Nowling, star player of the northern team. The locals proved more effective than the Muckers offense as a result, the invaders failed as often as the locals. The score at the half stood 15-11 in favor of Vegas.

The Tonopah defense was nearly as tight as the locals' but the Wildcats were able to get through it as the score proves.

Foremaster led the locals in scoring with 10 points, two of which were on foul shots and the rest on long shots from close to the center of the floor. Kay followed closely with 9 points, one of which was

NORWEGIAN WINS WORLD ICE TITLE
LAKE PLACID, N. Y., Feb. 20. (AP)—Ivan Ballangrud of Norway won both the 1500 and 10,000 meter races here today to capture the individual world speed skating championship. Of four events contested during the past two days, Ballangrud captured three first places and one third.

His victories gave Norway a clean sweep in the Championships. Naakon Pederson having placed first in the 500 meter race yesterday.

The first three places for individual performances also went to Norway. Ballangrud heads the list with a total point score of 199.26; Michael Staksrud second, 200.47; and Berndt Evensen third, 201.67. The points represent elapsed time in all four events.

Fourth place went to Bernat Taylor of the U. S., with 202.47, while Ossiian Blomquist of Finland placed fifth. Eddie Schroeder of Chicago was sixth and Valentine Biaslas of Utica seventh.

In today's races, which were skated on a time basis, the competitors made marks that caused the recent Olympic times to appear somewhat ridiculous.

WELTERWEIGHT TITLE VACANT
OAKLAND, Feb. 20. (AP)—The California welterweight title, held by Young Corbett III, was declared vacant by the state athletic commission today at its meeting here. The commission held the Fresno fighter forfeited title when he failed to fight within the 90-day period fixed by regulations.

Charley Cobb, San Diego, fledgling contender for the crown, filed application for the title.

Louis Parente, East Bay promoter, was granted permission to stage boxing matches in Oakland auditorium. Robert Edgren, member of the board, protested, alleging Parente mismatched fighters.

Oscar Klatt, former partner of Parente, was permitted to stage a show for the American Legion March 9. He was understood to be trying to match Max Baer and Hans Birkie.

A proposal by Edgren to declare wrestling matches exhibitions, or entertainment was defeated by other members.

FOREIGN 5'S PLAY IN VEGAS
Three basketball games that promise to be fast and furious will be played on the local hoop floor this week with the Wildcats holding the spotlight in two of them. The first of the games will be between Tonopah and Bunkerville on Monday evening.

Both of these teams have voiced the wish to meet on a neutral floor and decided that the Vegas court was the most desirable.

The Virgin valley squad defeated the Muckers by a 28-14 count on Thursday evening at Bunkerville and the Moapa Valley squad beat them 25-19 Friday night.

The second of these tilts will be on Wednesday evening when the Bunkervillesquad will meet the locals in a return game. The Bunkerville quintet defeated the Wildcats at Bunkerville in the first game of the season, but the Wildcats are a much better team now.

The Wildcats will clash with Ely on Thursday night in the third game of the program. The Ely basketballers defeated Tonopah at Ely several days ago and are reported to have a strong squad this year. Their schedule has been held up for several weeks because of the condition of the roads out of Ely.

One out-of-town game at Overton will end the week for the locals and will indicate if they have a chance in the race for the state hoop crown.
