MOHAMMEDAN HEAD LAUDS STATES

GENEVA, Feb. 20 (AP)—The Aga Khan, spiritual head of millions of Mohammedans, speaking as India's representative at the League of Nations disarmament conference today, paid a high tribute to the peace record of the United States.

Speaking English perfectly, his short, stocky form barely visible over the speaker's rostrum, the Indian prince announced India's support of the American disarmament proposals and added: "May I say her long record of combining peace with prosperity is one which fully entitled the United States to take the active part she already has taken in our deliberations. I look with hope and confidence for a continuance of her efforts."

Nanking Shrine Of New China's National Spirit

BY YELVIN E. COLEMAN NEW YORK, Feb. 20 (AP)—Nanking, latest locale to be cast under the shadow of Sino-Japanese hostilities, is the shrine city of Chinese nationalism.

Here was established the first capital of the Chinese republic in 1912. Here Dr. Sun Yat-sen, father of the revolution, took oath of office as first president and at the tomb of Emperor Hung Wu solemnly informed the spirit of that founder of the Ming dynasty that the Manchus at last had been overthrown.

Now, outside the old walled city on Purple mountain, Sun Yat-sen rests in an elaborate tomb, constructed during Chiang Kai-shek's regime with the idea that it would become the Mt. Vernon of China.

There is a strange mixture of the ancient and modern within Nanking. A city has existed on the site for 2,000 years, but it was without great political importance until Hung Wu made it his residence and called it Nanking, or "Southern Capital."

That monarch forced his way to the throne from obscure beginnings. Being thus a son of the people, he has become a legend symbolic of those who advocate "China for the Chinese."

The third Ming emperor moved his court to Peking (northern capital) so as to face savage hordes which threatened his northern borders, and for centuries Nanking slumbered, dreaming of her former glories, but always a prize in the eyes of those who sought power in the celestial kingdom.

POPULATION HAS DECLINED At one time the city had a million people, but its population has dwindled to less than 600,000, and now some of the massive old battlements that have withstood many a siege look down on bamboo groves or fields whose stone bridges across meandering creeks show where once busy streets crossed the waterways.

Like Shanghai, Nanking owes her modern importance largely to the Yangtze river. The city was proclaimed open to foreign trade by the French treaty of 1858, but was not formally made an open port until 1899.

Nanking is about 100 miles by rail and 250 by water from Shanghai. Ocean-going craft plow up the Yangtze to her docks, and hilly shores protect the place from floods.

PORT BUSINESS IN SUBURBS The port business is concentrated at Hsiakwan, the suburban district where the Japanese landed marines. There the forts on Lions Hill overlook the wharves, customs house, postoffice, shipping, ferry lines and railroad stations.

Seven miles south lies the main city, headquarters for the government since June 1928, when the nationalists drove old Chang Tso-Lin of Manchuria out of the "northern capital," changed its name to Peiping ("northern peace") and re-established Nanking as the nation's political center.
