Is there anyone who does not appreciate the shade of a large spreading tree and is there anything that repays so much for so little? There are many varieties of trees which will thrive in our community but there are also some trees which are not happy in our desert con-

ditions MANY POPULARS

The family of poplars contains many varieties of trees suitable for planting in our city. The well-known cottonwood (Poplus Fremonti) is the best known of all these due to the simplicity with which it may be propogated. This tree has many advantages, such as rapidity of growth. mature size and it thrives under all conditions, but it also has some disadvantages. The cotton from which the tree is named, is more or less of a nuisance and constitutes a fire hazard at the time it is dropping. The surface roots of the cottonwood make it difficult to converse a level even lawn beneath it. In many cities it is against the city ordinance to plant the cottonwood. The Caro-

lina poplar (Poplus Eugeni) is a splendid, large-growing shade tree which is rapid of growth and thrives but we have several that are pro-insing. This tree is grown exten-sively in the St. Gec. 3e district. SIBERIAN ELM This tree is planted extensively in


