Plans Flight



Lyman H. Tucker, above, 55-year-old newspaperman affiliated with the Press at Hilo, T. H., and L. H. McCurley, 32-year-old former army man, plan to inaugurate the trans-Pacific flight season in April by attempting a feat never before accomplished—an eastward flight from the Hawaiian Islands to the United States. If they reach the mainland and they are not too fatigued, the two hope to refuel their plane in the air and continue east, possibly to Salt Lake City or Kansas City.

LOAN AVAILABLE FOR UTAH BANKS

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, Feb. 22. (AP)—Money may be borrowed from the Reconstruction Finance corporation by defunct Utah banks to help pay their dividends, according to Governor George H. Dern upon his return today from the east where he directed with Wilson McCarthy, Utah director of the finance corporation on the matter.

Securities will be accepted at their normal value by the Finance corporation, he said, and a liberal view will be taken of bank's assets, resulting in liquidation of many present frozen assets. A test case must be taken to court to determine whether receivers may be advantaged by the action, he explained.

In speaking of the present economic condition of the world, Dern said the public's unwarranted lack of confidence in banks, and forced hoarding of money by banks to meet the demands, has badly curtailed credit.
