Some traders were of the opinion the move against the interest last week by exchange authorities had exhausted the short interest in the stock, making it susceptible to only a moderate increase in liquidation pressure. Others said the Wrigley estate was unloading its holdings of Auburn, a development that might also have been responsible for weakness in Paramount-Public.

Exchange authorities, while refusing to either confirm or deny various reports about Auburn, were understood to be keeping a close watch on the stock. Two governors last Saturday spent most of the trading session right at the Auburn post. Turnover in the stock today was 20,000 shares, or more than a third of the entire capitalization of 200,000 odd shares. Most of the stock, however, already is securely locked into the strong-boxes of E. L. Cord, president, his associates, and the Cord corporation, indicating that some of the stock turned over today changed hands several times.

The market as a whole showed discovered within the limits of the claims to constitute a valid discovery. That the mining locations have been abandoned. It is alleged in the contest proceedings: 1. That the land within the limits of the claims is non-mineral in character. 2. That minerals in sufficient quantities have not been

fairly strong resistance during the morning but later gradually lost strength. Some advocates of unrestricted short selling blamed the ease in which prices dropped on the sweeping plan made in the short interest last week when bears ran to cover on the stock exchange rule of loaning of stocks to shorts.

Union Pacific and Atchison, which were bid up rapidly on short selling last week, partially bore this viewpoint, the former issue breaking more than seven points on light transactions. Steel common, American Can, Allied Chemical and General Motors, however, closed with losses of 1 1/2 to 3 1/2 points. Corresponding declines occurred in other leaders.

Undismayed by the weakness in various sections of the list, a number of pools continued to operate in favored issues. New York Traction shares were bid up on the familiar unification talk, while American Woolen issues, Servel, McKeesport Tin Plate and Columbian Carbon were strong for a time. Some of these issues closed with gains.

Considerable pressure today was apparent from commission houses who were active buyers of stocks last week on the strength of the administration's anti-deflation policy. Many traders made speculative purchases at that time but quickly dumped their holdings today on widespread selling advices sent out by brokerage houses. Few would hazard any guesses as to the immediate course of the market, however, preferring to stand aside to watch the action of the market itself.
