MARKETS AT A GLANCE

NEW YORK

NEW YORK, Feb. 25. (U.P.)—A dull and uninteresting stock market gave no hint of an impending reduction in the New York federal reserve bank rediscount rate after the close of the market today, a step obviously taken by the central banking authorities to stimulate business activity.

Reduction of the rate from 3 1/2 to 3 per cent was expected further to bolster security prices and was an additional move in the program of government and banking authorities to aid general business with a liberal and cheap credit policy.

Although the cut in the bank rate had been expected for some time, the action of the stock market today gave little indication that such a move would take place after the close. On a turnover of only a million shares, stocks fluctuated nervously in a narrow range, ending about where they began.

The volatile Auburn suffered another sinking spell, breaking more than ten points to a new low and then recovering moderately.

Traders saw nothing in the day's news on which to base large-scale operations and the trend of prices changed frequently. Larger than usual spreads between successive sales was attributed to lack of large short interest on one hand, and reluctance of traders to increase professional selling operations on the other.

Shares which showed at least temporary abandonment of their sinking spell, including Kruger & Toli, Radio, Alaska Juneau, and Standard Brands, United Aircraft, however, was strong on hopes in some quarters that the company would obtain some aircraft orders from the Far East hostilities.

Brooklyn-Manhattan Transit was strong for a while on a revival of unification rumors and reports of a possible 7-cent fare, while National Distillers moved up following inauguration of dividends at the rate of \$2.50 annually on the preferred stock. United States Industrial Alcohol advanced sympathetically.

The few weeks' most indicative drying up of important selling pressure. In some quarters, however, it was believed that the reduction of the bank rate completely changed the market outlook and that prices had been provided with a new stimulus.

Commodity prices continued improved today. Grains held relatively steady but cotton continued its advance.

KANSAS CITY LIVESTOCK

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Feb. 25. (U.P.)—Cattle were strong to a quarter higher in light trade on the Kansas City market today. Most steers sold around \$4.50 to \$7. Calves were steady to 50 cents lower, with most veals quotable around \$6 to \$7.

The stocker and feeder market was very slow, but steady, with most quotations around \$3.50 to \$5.50. Top fat hogs sold around \$3.50, down 5 cents from yesterday, and most sales ranged around \$3.60 to \$3.75.

Sheep trade was slow, prices steady to lower. Fat lambs were quotable around \$6 to \$6.50.
