Steers and yearlings were quotable around \$4.50 to \$6.50. Calves were unchanged, most veals around \$6 to \$7. Not enough was done in stockers and feeders to make a market.

MARKETS AT A GLANCE

By RICHARD L. GRIDLEY (United Press Financial Editor) NEW YORK, Feb. 26 (U.P.)—Another stimulating rise in the bond market on easier credit developments failed to shake the stock market out of its lethargy today and prices continued their narrow and meaningless movements.

National Gypsum Co. declares a dividend of \$1.75 a share on the preferred stock on account of arrears; Standard Brands, Inc., declares regular quarterly dividend of 30 cents a share on common stock.

Price movements in stocks and volume of trading were even smaller than in yesterday's bull session. Many active shares held within a range of one to two points, while transactions fell to approximately 900,000 shares, the lowest since February 4. Most leaders closed near previous levels with the bear crowd gaining a slight advantage.

Principal interest centered on a handful of lower priced favorites in which pools have been active. As a result many of the leaders were crowded off the tape. At the time acute weakness cropped out in a few individual issues.

Strength in United States government bonds overshadowed all other developments of the day and spread to other sections of the bond market. Indications of easier money cheered traders and were strengthened by passage of the Glass-Steagall credit expansion bill by congress.

Several pools paid little attention to the prevailing lethargy. Gillette Safety Razor was turned over in large blocks at its best levels of the current movement. Directors last week declared a quarterly dividend of 25 cents a share on the common stock, the first payment since a year ago. Traders interpreted this as indicating directors were optimistic regarding the outlook.

Heavy mid-western selling was blamed for another acute break in Utilities Power and Light A stock and bonds. The shares fell 2 points to a new record low at \$6 a share, although the company has paid annual dividends at the rate of \$2 annually since 1925. Early elimination of the dividend is expected. European rumors that Swedish Match would cut its payment resulted in a slump in the Kreuger & Toll issues.

A soft spot in the bond market was a new sinking spell in Japanese obligations on darkening war clouds in the far east. The Japanese yen in the foreign exchange market touched a new low for all time at 3 1/2 cents, compared with par of 49 4-5 cents.
