## PERMITS FOR NEW STORES ARE ISSUED AT BOULDER; CLOTHING SHOP FOR MEN WILL BE OPENED

Permits for two new stores were issued Saturday, it was announced last night.

One, issued to Mennox and Vaughn, formerly of Montana, is for a department store, housing a general store, meat market, furniture and hardware departments, and a completely equipped drug store.

The building is to be located at the corner of Avenue B and Arizona streets, and will be 60 by 120 feet in size. Contract for the construction of the building has been let to E. J. Allen, building contractor.

A permit was also issued to Sorrel's Inc., for a building to be occupied by a drug store. Contract for the erection of the building, to be located on Nevada street, has been let to P. S. Webb.

A new men's store is also in prospect for Boulder City in the near future, it was learned.

To be located in the Motor Terminal building on Nevada street, the store will be opened on or about March 5, according to William Harrison and "Stoney" Stone, partners in the new establishment.

All types of men's clothing and furnishings will be sold at popular prices, according to Stone and Harrison. Seaking of his plans for the new enterprise Harrison said last night "We are going to have our store full to the top with brand, spanking new things from the style centers of the nation, at prices that will fit any pocketbook on the reservation."

Stone has recently been connected with the Long Beach store of Desmond's, famous southern California clothiers, and for several years was associated with the Dodd N. Hillis clothing company of Long Beach.

"Bill" Harrison was for ten years in the clothing business in Thermopolis, Wyo., and for the past two years has been manager of the men's clothing department of the Billit Wright company of Long Beach.

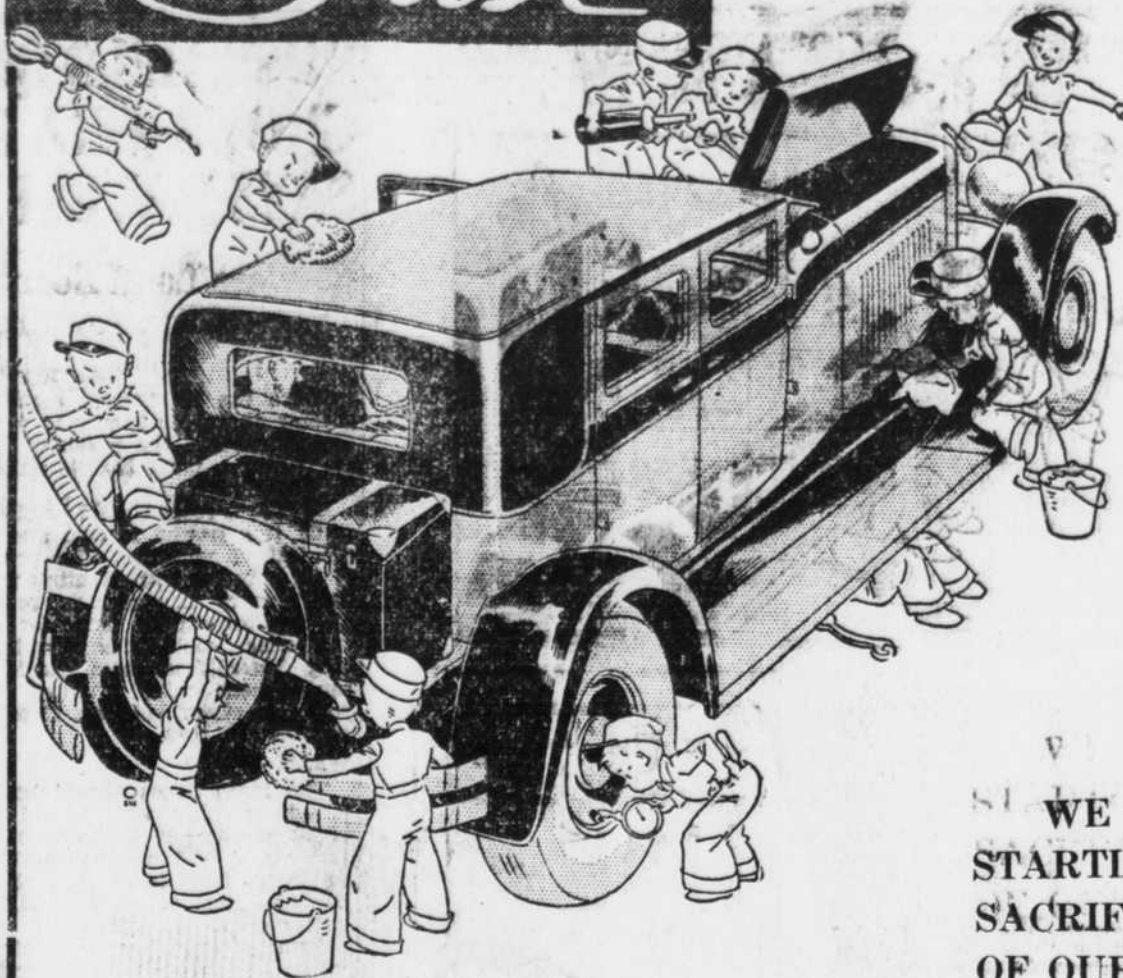
