Between these two sections of the building, in the basement, a series of folding doors provide space for the dining room, which, means of these doors, can be closed off into three additional class ooms, making a total of ten class ooms, nine in the basement and ne on the main floor.

On the main floor, the assembly all will occupy one complete wing of the building, with the west end f the hall devoted to space for the organ, choir, and pulpit. A bishops oom is to communicate directly with the end of the hall.

The seating capacity of between 400 and 500 persons includes a balconv over the east end of the assembly hall which will seat about

The other wing of the building will be occupied by a recreation hall. At the south end of the hall presentation of plays, oratorical room. contests, and other entertainment features. More than three-quarters of the remaining space in thi wing of the building will be devoted to space for dancing and temporary seating. At the other end, around a fireplace, a loung-ing alcove will be furnished for spectators during dancing and other entertainments.

Plans for financing the new edifice have been completed and an erection schedule tentatively set which indicates that the building will be ready for dedication about





while the ground is cool and the roses being grown successfully here, air full of moisture. The pruning on the whole they are not satisof roses begins with planting unless factory in our summer heat. the nursery has already reduced top growth to three or four of 83,000 standard roses, everyone good canes, each six or eight inches may be satisfied. However, the long. Established roses should receive their chief pruning every sometime between December and March first.

WEAK WOOD

The main canes should be kept few in number and headed back about one-half each winter, cutting just above bud on the outside of canes so that future growth will be out. Remove weak wood, keep center open.

Summer pruning generally is given after plants have been alowed to rest in July and should lighter, just enough to root during the growing and flowering season.
