BOULDER ELECTRICIANS GET TAKEN IN ON "ALL AMERICAN" CANAL JOB RACKET; NOW SEEKING OLD FRIEND

Job rackets come and job rackets go, but the latest to be reported from Boulder City victimized more men than have ever before "fallen" for such schemes in the government city.

More than forty electricians working in Boulder City and on the Hoover Dam are poorer by from \$10 to \$30 dollars as the result of the activities of a man, whose name is withheld, who promised electrician friends of his jobs on the All-American canal project.

According to reports from Boulder City, the man had been employed there for some time, when he appeared with a set of spurious credentials establishing him as a boss electrician on the new job. Having made many "friends" in Boulder City, he promised them all jobs working for him on the new canal.

Shortly after promising a job, it was his practice to appear with a hard-luck story and borrow a sum varying from \$10 to \$30.

Came last payday, with all the man's friends looking to be repaid their loans. Their "friend" drew his check, but instead of paying off the amounts borrowed, the man is said to have disappeared.

Having a complete record of the man's past connection, Boulder City authorities are making an effort to locate him through relatives and former employers, to bring him back on fraud charges.
