FIRST EXPERIMENTAL BATCHES OF CONCRETE POURED AT RIVER PLANT

Following a series of tests, ex-perimental batches of concrete were poured for the first time from the world's largest machine of its type, at the low level plant near the dam site last week.

The plant which was designed to mix 75% of the concrete to be used in the construction of the huge dam as well as all concrete for tunnel linings is fully automatic in

Each one of a battery of four mixers is capable of loading, mixing and discharging a 16½ yard batch of concrete every 3½ min-

The concrete is discharged from the mixers directly into cylindrical agitators mounted on a truck chasis. The concrete is kept in motion by the turning of the cylinder and arrives at its destination

in perfect condition. Three of these trucks are now operation with 15 additional trucks of the same design on hand ready to be used in placing the three-foot concrete lining in the di-

version tunnels. The first concrete poured under terms of the Six Companies, Inc., contract were used in the foundation for the trash rack structures which will be built in front of the upper portal of diversion tunnel

Number Two. Official tabulations of concrete yardage poured on trash rack structure foundations show 130 yards poured Saturday, 160 yards Sunday and 160 yards yesterday.
