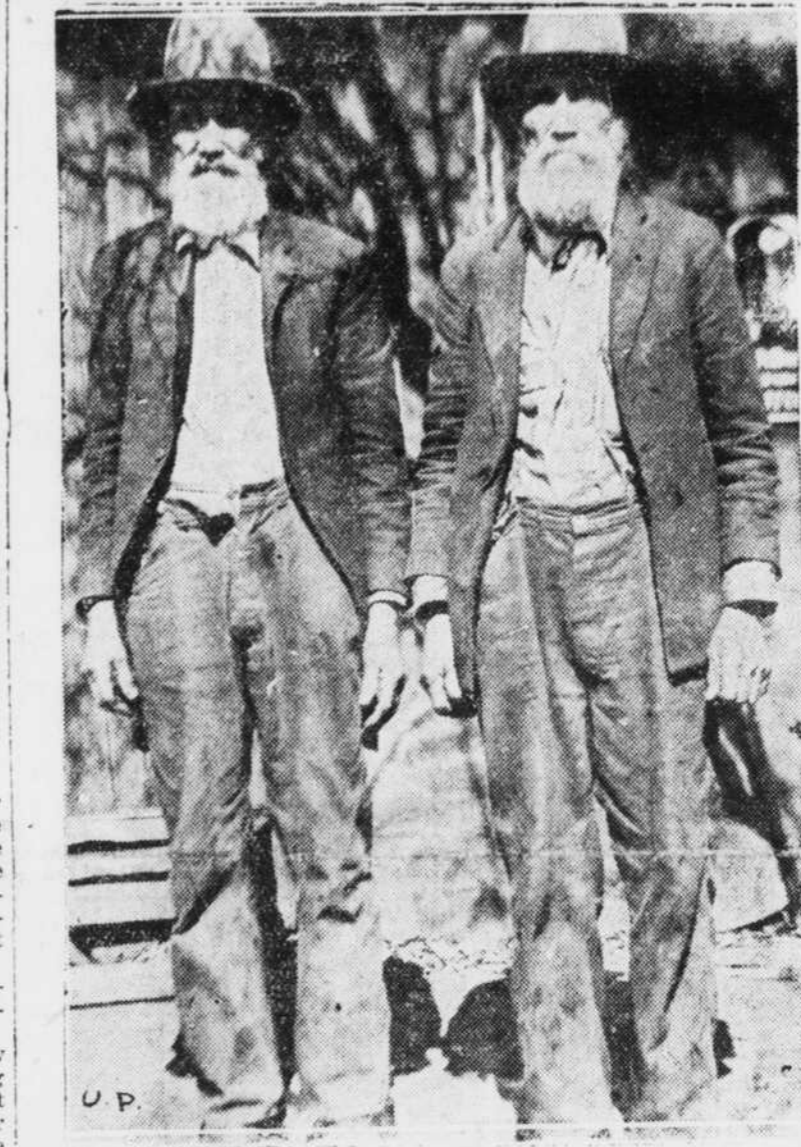

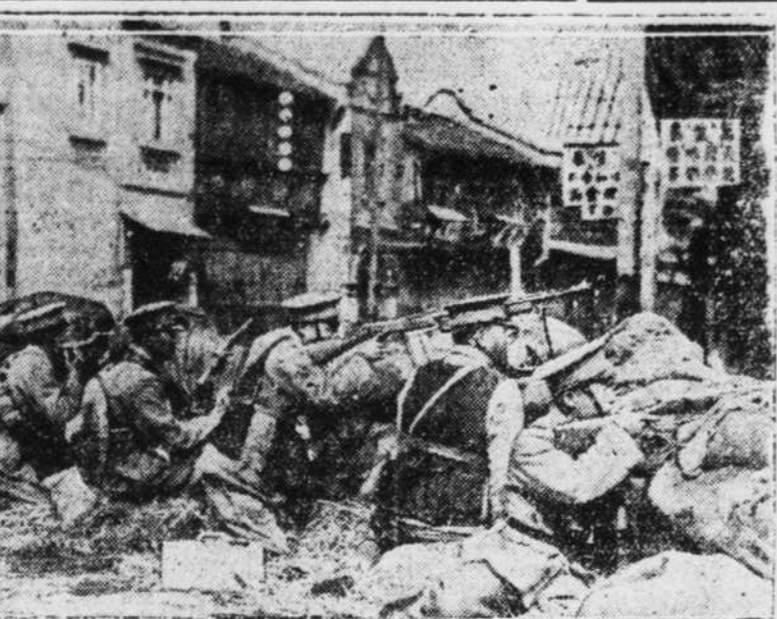
MAIMED YOUTH DEFIES DEATH

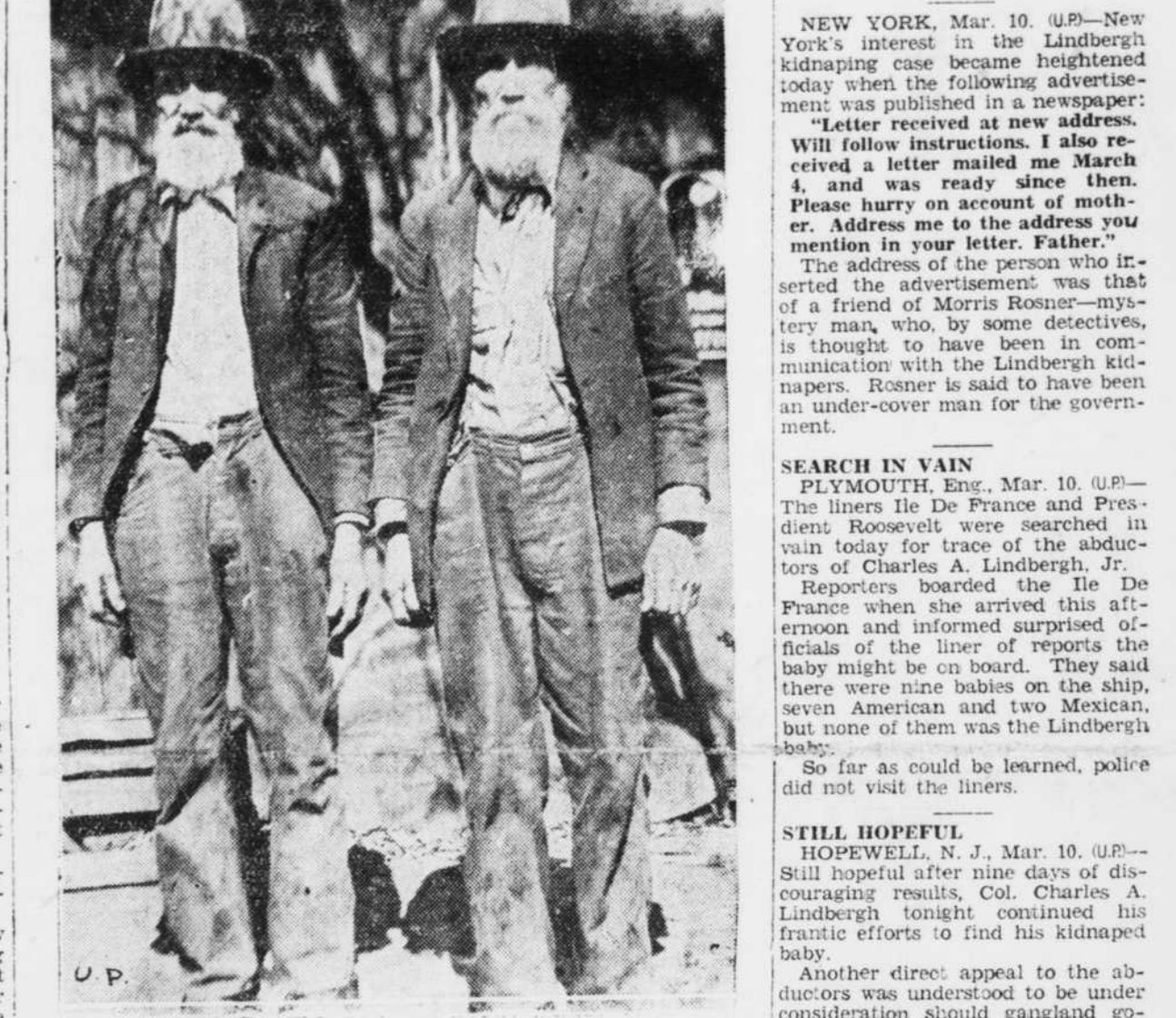
