## CONTINUANCE OF WORK ON DAM ASSURED—ODDIE WINS FIGHT FOR FUNDS

WASHINGTON, Mar. 10.—Spelling victory for Senator Tasker L. Oddie's fight against additional cuts in appropriations for the construction of Hoover dam, the senate yesterday passed an amendment to the interior department appropriation bill, increasing the appropriation from \$8,000,000 to \$10,000,000.

Both Senators Oddie and Pittman took the floor of the senate chamber in behalf of the amendment. The money becomes available as soon as the bill is signed by President Hoover, and insures the continuance of work at Hoover dam without any letup in the intensity with which the work is being done.

## BRUNZELL HAS LOW BID ON GARAGES

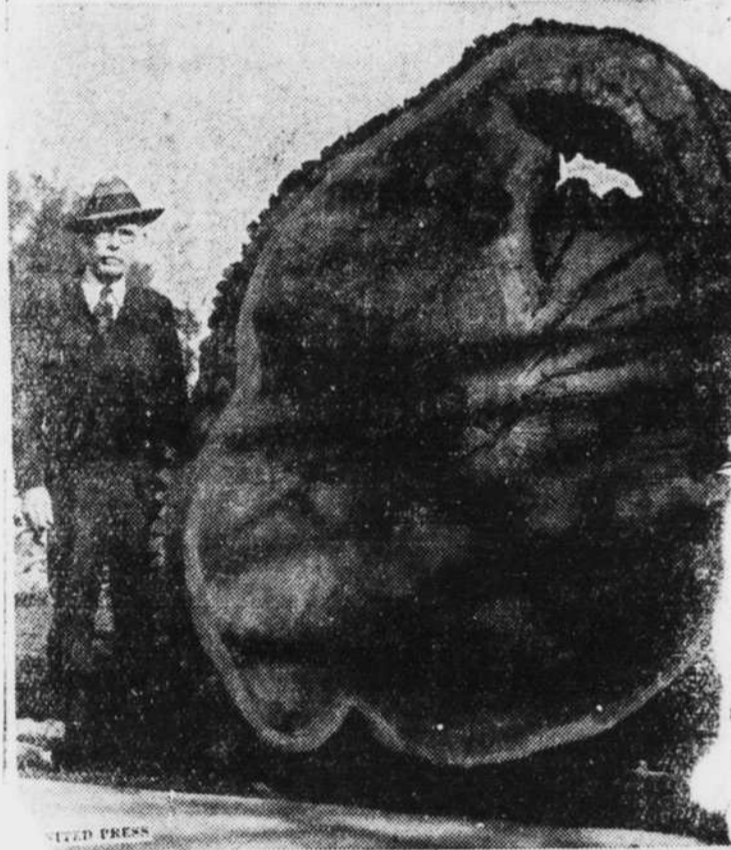
Bids were opened Thursday by reclamation bureau officials in Boulder City, from contractors for the building of three new government garages in the reservation city. V. O. Brunzell, Boulder City contractor, was the lowest of ten bidders, with an offer of \$3,218. Next in order came I. M. Bay of Junction, Utah, with \$3,504 and H. E. Schraiver of Salt Lake City with \$3,588. The bids will be forwarded immediately to the Denver office of the reclamation bureau and the contract awarded by that office. The work is scheduled to start within ten days of the award, and to be completed within 90 days thereafter. The garages will be three in number, two to house 12 cars each and one 20 cars. They will be of brick, and of composition roofs.

## DESPONDENT MAN COMMITS SUICIDE AT BEVERLY HILLS

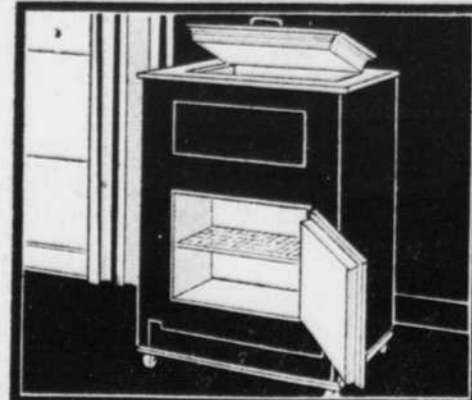
