MARKETS AT A GLANCE

By RICHARD L. GRIDLEY (United Press Financial Writer) (NEW YORK, Mar. 10. U.P.)—With many of the larger traders continuing to look upon the stock market with distrust, heavy pool buying in a handful of individual issues today failed to prevent the list from slipping to slightly lower levels.

Losses were not as extensive as those in the preceding session and activity fell to about a million shares. On the bond market prices continued to rise, the list scoring its eleventh successive daily advance.

Extremely narrow movements in stocks and continued uncertainty over the immediate business outlook kept many traders out of the market. Although many of them were afraid to sell short, they were sufficiently uncertain regarding the future to withdraw from the market for the time being.

The market showed continued good resistance to further advance news developments in the form of several important actual and prospective dividend cuts and the February unfilled order report of the United States Steel Corporation showing backlog of \$2,345,629 tons, the lowest in the company's history, and a decrease of 102,521 tons during the month.

On the other side of the news ledger was the further indication of a return to normal in European affairs. The Bank of England reduced its discount rate from 5 to 4 per cent followed by corresponding cuts at Dublin and Copenhagen. The English cut had been expected in view of the heavy inflow of foreign money to London, attracted by the high interest rates and indications that England had successfully weathered its financial storm.

Because the rate cut lacked the element of surprise, it exercised little influence on stock price movements here. The British pound sterling again lost a part of its sensational advance of earlier in the week. After the close of the market the federal reserve board reported an increase of \$57,000,000 in brokerage loans during the past week to a total of \$552,000,000. This was the first substantial increase in the loan account in nearly a year and was hailed in some quarters as definite indication of the ending of the deflation in stocks.

The market has become so hardened to adverse dividend news that several additional important reductions and omissions today influenced only the shares affected. These included omissions on International Telephone, Interstate Department Stores common, and American and Foreign Power \$6 and \$7 preferreds, and reductions from \$2.50 annually on Gold Dust common to \$1.60 and \$2 on National Steel.

Special buying activities were conducted in a wide variety of special issues, indicating the pools were determined to push the market into higher ground. Aided by a large short interest built up on the recent decline, they were successful in forcing Auburn up nearly 5 points, International Silver, Alaska Juneau, Homestake Mining and Noranda mines among the metal issues were strong throughout but large copper producers were mixed on continued uncertainty over negotiations by world producers to effect worldwide cut in production to 15 per cent of capacity.
