

TRACK JINX IS WOULD CLEAN BROKEN BY PHAR LAP BOXING OF RACKET

NEW YORK, March 21 (U.P.)—Phar Lap, greatest money-winning gelding of all time, has broken the jinx that marked the appearance of Edward and Papyrus, the previous foreigners that were unsuccessful in their invasion of tracks on the North American continent. In winning the Agua Caliente handicap the mighty son of Night Raid and Entreaty advanced to the position of the second largest money-winning thoroughbred of the world.

With earnings of \$322,250, Phar Lap threatens to eclipse the record earnings of Sun Beau, the record-holder, which amassed \$376,744 in five years of extensive campaigning. The Australian champion is now within \$44,494 of equalling the mark of the retired son of Sun Briar-Beautiful Lady.

Phar Lap is named for the Stars and Stripes handicap, Arlington handicap and Arlington gold cup, three \$30,000 added stakes to be run at the Cotago track this summer, and many other races are open to him. He will certainly not lack opportunities on the American turf.

GORILLA JONES LOSES LICENSE

BOSTON, March 21 (U.P.)—The license of Gorilla Jones, Akron, O., middleweight, to fight in Massachusetts was suspended indefinitely today by the state boxing commission.

The suspension resulted from Jones' stalling in his bout with Frankie O'Brien of Hartford, Conn., at Holyoke, March 14. The bout was stopped in the eighth.

Jones is the National Boxing Association's middleweight champion.

CHICAGO, March 21 (U.P.)—A campaign to drive the racketeering element out of the boxing game has been started by the National Boxing Association, it was revealed today in the regular weekly bulletin issued by General John V. Clinchin, president of the N. B. A.

"A decided movement on the part of certain managers and so-called booking agencies for boxers to make a 'racket' out of the boxing sport by matching inferior boxers with outstanding contenders has been called to the attention of the N. B. A.," said the bulletin. "It is said that some of these agencies go so far as to arrange fake boxing matches with a full understanding between the contestants before hand."

"Whenever it is found that a 'ringer' or fake fight is foisted upon the public it is suggested that all parties to the affair be called before the commission and suspended for life, thereby cleansing the sport of the parasites, who would destroy boxing as a sport for personal gain or to build up a false reputation for their boxers."

An investigation of a bout involving Mickey Walker, former middleweight champion, at Salt Lake City March 11 was one of the contributing factors to the stand taken by the N. B. A., Gen. Clinchin said.

"Walker is supposed to have met Jimmy Mahoney of Boston at Salt Lake City on March 11, but on investigation I found that Mahoney was in Boston at the time," Jack Kearns, Walker's manager, now claims that the fighter Walker met was Jimmy Mahoney of Chicago. The names Mahoney and Mahoney are similar but there is no similarity between Chicago and Boston.

Walker also engaged in a bout with Jackie Williams at Denver recently, knocking him out in two rounds. Williams is now demonstrating a patented punching bag worn around the neck at the Chicago stadium when fights, hockey games are staged there.

GAR WOOD PLANS MISS AMERICA X

NEW YORK, March 21 (U.P.)—Gar Wood, holder of the world's speedboat record, today announced that he has begun work on a Miss America X to defend the Harmsworthy trophy next September at Detroit against Kay Don's new Miss England III.

The boat will be similar to her predecessor in design and will contain the same motors that have performed in three other ships.

In designing the Miss America X Wood has made several radical changes in hull construction. He believes increased speed will come from efficiency of the boat itself rather than from the motors.

Nevada's track and field aspirants under the tutelage of their new mentor, Coach "Brick" Mitchell, will start an intensive training grind this week. The conditioning of the men has been rather irregular during the past several days and it will require a great deal of concentration on this sport in order to bring everyone around into the required form. Several of the men have been training diligently during the good weather, but it is expected that a much larger turnout will be in evidence from now on.

Coach Mitchell, who turned out some record making teams down at San Francisco, naturally feels that it will be difficult to put out a squad that will be able to compete with such aggregations as Fresno State and San Jose this year.
