

NOTED FLIER DIES IN FALL

NEW YORK, April 1. (AP)—Capt. Harry Rogers, 36, one of the best known of American aviators, was killed today when his airplane crashed in Bowers bay, near the Curtiss airport at North Beach, Flushing.

An employe of the airport, Edward Artega, 32, suffered a broken collar-bone and other severe injuries.

Roger's plane fell shortly after he left the airport. Engine trouble developed and Rogers was unsuccessful in his attempt to glide to a landing, chiefly due to a gust of wind which whirled the craft into a nose dive at an altitude of 100 feet.

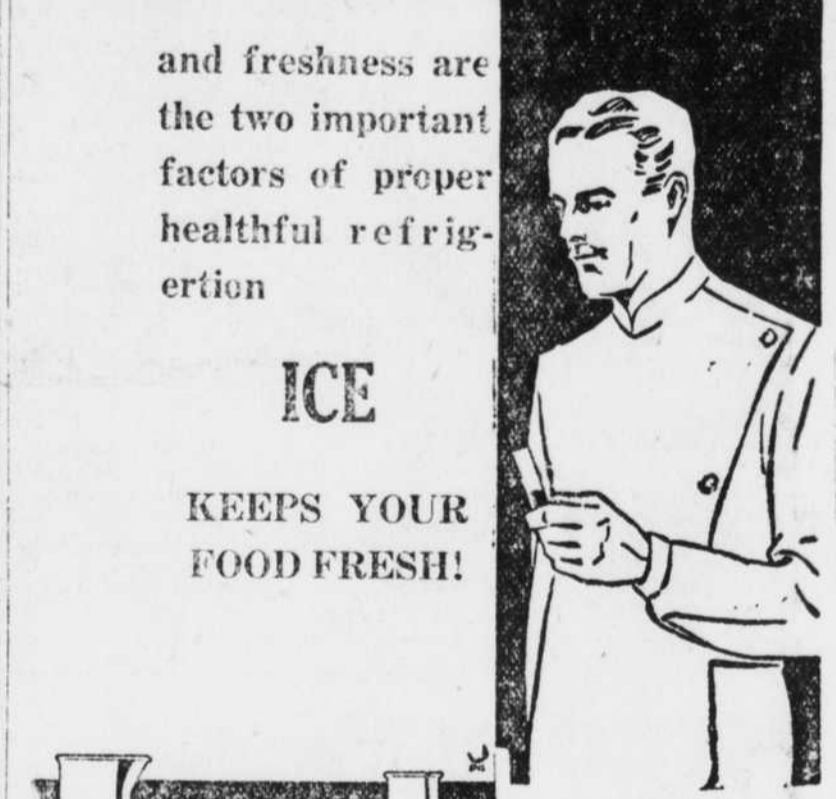
MAUDE ADAMS BACK IN UTAH
