### FILM STORY OF DAM BUILDING IS CONTINUED BY CAMERAMEN

Work of recording progress of operations at the Hoover dam project in motion pictures, one of the many functions of the public and press relations department, headed by Norman S. Gallison, was witnessed by visitors at the dam yesterday.

Lloyd Ahern, cameraman of the Paramount motion picture studio of Hollywood is assisting Gallison in filming one of the Six Companies' periodical progress pictures.

Shots of men in action on the

spillways, human files suspended on long ropes, scaling the 650 foot perpendicular canyon cliffs and men riding the skip, suspended from steel cables spanning the river, were taken.

Approximately 600 feet of film was shot yesterday with more scheduled to be taken today.

The last previous work of this nature included 2000 feet of film showing the Six Companies' huge gravel washing plant in action.

### FINAL SHOT OPENS TUNNEL

Timed with precision at exactly 7:12 Sunday evening the last shot of dynamite was used to hole through the bench heading of the main diversion tunnel No. 1, on the Nevada side of the river.

With this work completed there remains only the invert section of the tunnels to be excavated, of which 15,998 feet representing approximately half, has already been removed.

Coincident with tunnel excavation the work of pouring concrete for the tunnel lining is progressing rapidly.
