Roe contracted pneumonia while attempting to make the trip to his home in Bozeman, Mont., to join his wife and children. He was taken ill at Caliente, Calif., and was forced to return to Boulder City. His many friends in his home town will be shocked and grieved to learn of his passing as he was loved by all who knew him. He leaves his wife and two children, Ida and Lynn, of Bozeman; his mother and father, Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Roe, two sisters, Mrs. Chas. Bassett and Miss Billie Roe, four brothers, Tom, Charles, Tim and Clyde, all of Boulder City, and a sister, Mrs. Helen Huffman of Phillipsburg, Mont., who will arrive in Boulder City Thursday to attend his funeral. Temporary burial will take place in Las Vegas, but later the remains will be taken to his home at Bozeman for their last resting place.

Mr. Roe was born at Corbin, Mont., and was 36 years of age. He had been an employe of the Six Companies for several months and had many friends in Boulder City.

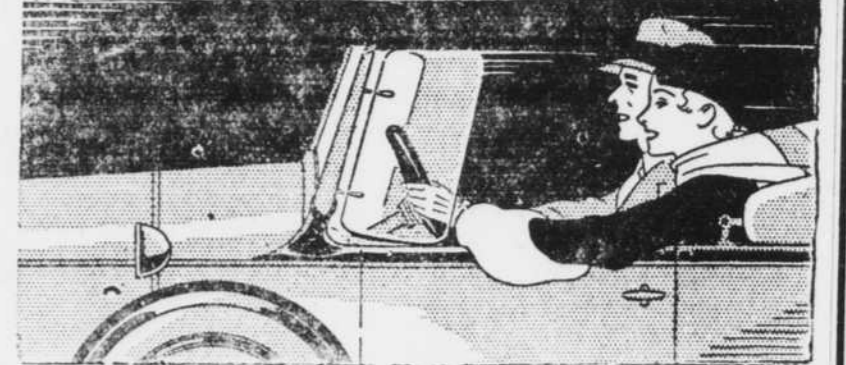
