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THURSDAY IN CONGRESS

SENATE Democrats after a party caucus agreed the house deficit of the sales tax in the billion dollar revenue bill was "conclusive." Commerce committee agreed to vote on April 14 on the Wagner bill creating a national system of federal state employment agencies. Secretary of State Stimson advised Chairman Jones of his objections to any reduction in salaries of persons in the foreign service. Senator Huey Long, Dem. La., introduced a new anti-trust bill which he said would give "little business people of the nation some relief." Voted to set aside a \$5,000,000 fund for relief of southern storm sufferers. HOUSE Expenditures committee for the fourth time refused to report the Byrns bill for consolidation of the war and navy departments. Interstate commerce committee favorably reports a bill for retroactive abolition of the reciprocity clause of the interstate commerce act. Rep. Wright Patman, Dem., Tex., made public telegrams from several southern Legion posts opposing the stand of National Commander Byrns in his anti-bonus declarations.
