families in order to provide a shelter. Due to the generosity of the people of Clark county we have been fairly well supplied with clothing, but it has been absolutely necessary in some cases to purchase shoes.

OTHER NEEDS

While it is true that unemployment creates the need for assistance in some instances, and is an important contributing factor in others, there are needs created by illness, widowhood, desertion and old age. We meet these needs to the best of our ability. Our first consideration is always the welfare of the family or person who comes to us and our aim is to help them help themselves.

We have been able to arrange for five families to return to the homes of relatives who were able and willing to care for them, thus making it possible for the families to permanently better themselves and for us to lessen our load.

We feel very definitely that we are not justified in using our funds to furnish gas to people who are just traveling about depending upon charitable organizations to finance their trips. However, if they can give evidence that they are going to work at their destination or have relatives or friends who will sup-
