Call For Oxygen Sent **Out By Frontier** Community

BY HAROLD WALLER United Press Staff Correspondent BUENOS AIRES, April 11 (U.F)— Mighty volcanos of the South American Andes erupted violently today, spreading a grey blanket of ash across the continent and releasing gases which raised fears for the safety of the populations of interior cities in Argentina and

The ministry of interior received alarming reports from the Province of Mendoza, where authorities urgently requested a supply of oxygen DANGER GRAVE

The township of Malargue, on the Argentine frontier, in Mendoza province, appeared to be the center of the gravest danger. The authorities of Malargue reported 16 inches of ash had fallen on the town by sundown and that the atmosphere was heavily charged with sulphur fumes which made breathing ex-

tremely difficult. The Malargue authorities asked for oxygen tubes and forwarded a similar request from the town of San Rafael, which reported similar

conditions. The volcanic peaks, on the Chilean-Argentine frontier spouted across the continent to Buenos Aires and the Uruguayan capital of Montevideo, and moved more slowly northward toward Santiago, capital of Chile. Deep underground rumbthe eruption, terrorizing many thou-

sands of persons in towns of Argentina, Chile and Uruguay. The ash and gases were reported by fliers, to be very obnoxious, and

moved slowly on Santiago. It was estimated that more than 2,000 tons of volcanic ash fell on Buenos Aires up to 9 p.m. If the estimate is approximately correct the weight of ashes which fell on the hundreds of square miles in the interior would be almost too great

for calculation. The ash was said to contain a fair proportion of fertilizing agents and therefore may benefit the agricultural land over an enormous area. The erupting volcanoes were be-
