### BOULDER INN TO BE ERECTED DOWNTOWN; JOB WILL START EARLY IN MAY, SAYS GRAY

Announcing the fact that a lease had been drawn up late yesterday for the site of Boulder Inn, Boulder City's new 100 room hotel, Sims Ely, Boulder City manager, said the new hotel would in all probability occupy the downtown site diagonally opposite the theater.

This is the first definite step taken in making a decision on one of the two locations under consideration since the hotel permit was issued to Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Gray.

After having given the hill site west of the administration building due consideration, it was decided by Mr. and Mrs. Gray that the downtown location held forth greater advantages, being more centrally located and more accessible to townspeople as well as tourists.

The Grays, who are registered at the Overland hotel at Las Vegas, will leave tomorrow or next day for San Francisco where Mr. Gray will transact business in connection with the new hotel, as well as attend to his personal interests in the mining field.

Construction of Boulder Inn will start immediately after the Grays return to Boulder City in about two weeks.

The hotel site will occupy eleven lots, numbers 11 to 17 inclusive, fronting on Wyoming street. These lots have a depth of 270 feet, extending through the entire block. The building will have a frontage of 135 feet.
