If Mr. Sam Abraham will call at The Age office, he will receive a free ticket, good for today only at the Airdome theater.

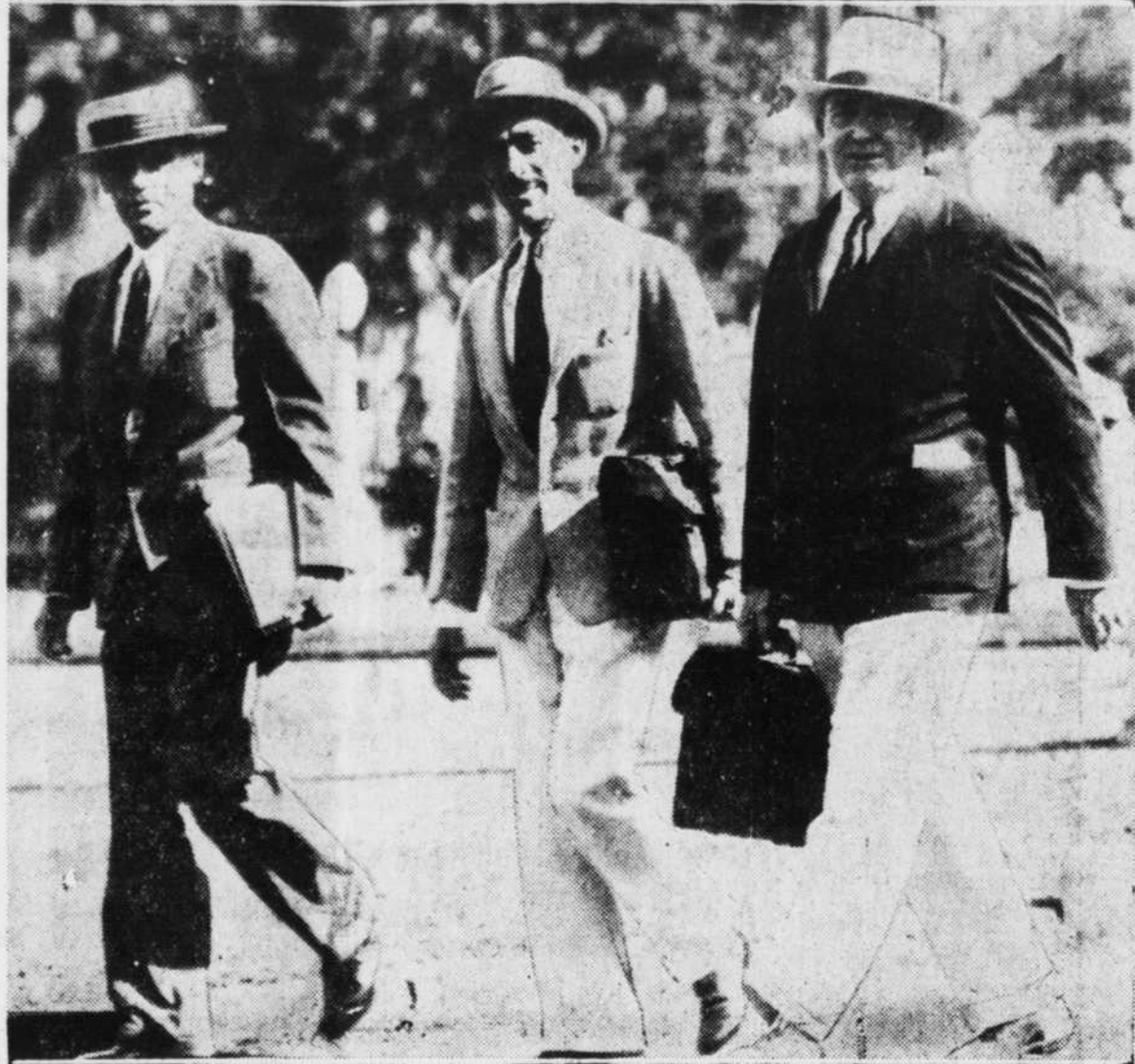

Las Vegas -- Its Future Things To Look Forward To

By J. C. FISHER Do the people of Las Vegas realize that some day in the near future, the government of the United States is going to be forced to establish within 300 miles of the Pacific ocean, the greatest defense sea and air port in this nation?

INTEREST OF NATION The United States is largely interested in Las Vegas and Boulder City, because of its large investment in Hoover Dam. What is more natural than the establishment of such a port in Las Vegas, where the open valleys for landing are numerous and where the big seaplanes can land and practice on Mead Lake.

Las Vegas and Boulder City are twin cities and the destiny of Las Vegas needs the aid that a partner like the United States furnishes. The next war will be fought in the air and the entire Pacific coast needs the big air port for its protection, and the reserve force must be located inland about 300 miles. With careful planning and political maneuvering in time, this great plum can be landed much easier than the passage of the Boulder dam bill through congress.

A GREAT HOSPITAL And what is more natural than the location of the greatest veterans' hospital in the United States, in Boulder City? The air port and the hospital are both within reach of the people of Las Vegas. With the United States interested in the dam to the extent of \$163,000,000, and with a model city already built, it is merely a matter of little effort to bring the other two big projects to the city of Las Vegas.

A RACE TRACK The whole world is sport mad. Everybody wants to play. That is what is drawing the world to California. There should be a playground in the desert. Las Vegas and Hoover Dam can draw the big overflow from California. For some years past this city has been expecting the sporting world to enter this field and develop it, but the dam project overshadowed all other projects and nothing in the way of promoting such an enterprise was encouraged, but now it can be seen that a racetrack would be a life-saver while the big dam is under construction. The writer, who can provide a very attractive 100-acre

tract near the city on the Hoover highway, has made some effort to interest the sporting world, feels that a race track can be established here as soon as the depression lifts its gloom. But it will require effort and boosting to secure a plum like a race track. It would be the biggest money producer for Las Vegas business people, especially its hotels and restaurants.

THE DAM AND CHEAP POWER Many things can and should be done for Las Vegas before the dam can be finished and cheap power can be had.

That cheap power will build a city here can not be doubted. We recall what cheap power did for Niagara Falls and Buffalo, 30 miles from the power plants. To illustrate it further, look at the city of Great Falls, Montana. A few years ago Great Falls, at the headwaters of the Missouri river, was a small, unknown village. The Anaconda Copper company put the falls to work by producing power and moved one of its plants to Great Falls.

Today it is a city of over 30,000 people. If cheap power can do that for a town like Great Falls, Boulder dam power should build a city of 100,000 people right here in Las Vegas.

Las Vegas, with its location, its climate, its altitude, and its highways, has a brighter future than any town of its size in the United States.

When the dam is completed there will be a big exodus from Boulder City, but none from Las Vegas and the great wealth, the great investment of the United States will remain forever at the door of this little city of destiny.
