### BIDS SUBMITTED FOR BOULDER CITY SCHOOL; MAY BE OPENED SOON

Boulder City parents may be glad to know that today they are a step nearer having their own school in the reservation city. Bids have been asked by the reclamation bureau, and will probably be opened by that office Tuesday.

There is an "if" even in this matter, though, when it is learned that the bureau has asked for and received bids on the proposed structure, but that this is only a tentative program which will save time only in the event the appropriation for the school is passed by congress.

The structure will cost approximately \$50,000, and will be in keeping with other Boulder City architecture. The building will be located just north of the municipal building and will be modern in every detail.

Students from the reservation have been attending the Las Vegas schools at the expense of Clark county. When the plans were drawn up for Boulder as a model city, it was later discovered that they had failed to provide for schools.

After discovery of the error congress was asked to make an appropriation for the erection of suitable buildings.

### ATTACK CASE IS CONTINUED

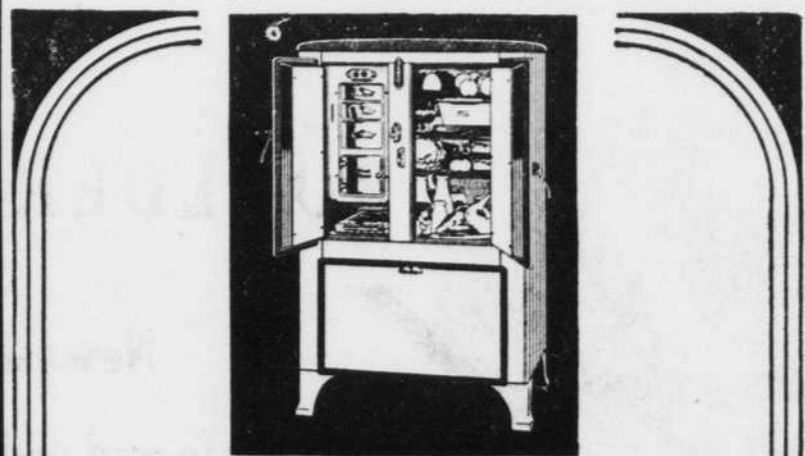
The preliminary hearing of Joe Schultz and Curley Hayes, alleged attackers of a young mother near Searchlight on March 28, will be continued in the justice court of Judge Frank M. Ryan in Las Vegas Monday.

Unless the men are freed after the preliminary hearing, they will be held to answer for their alleged crime in district court, presided over by Judge William E. Orr.

It is expected that one of the largest crowds ever to enter a justice court room in Clark county will be present when the hearing is resumed. District Attorney Harley A. Harmon is of the opinion that he has a strong chance of sending the men to the death house for the attack.
