GOOD AUTHORITY

WE READ with interest and pleasure an editorial in the Nevada State Journal, of recent date entitled "Fairness to All." The editorial calls attention to the fact that the remark in question, "about every third man in Las Vegas is a deputy marshal, whose job is to see that every man votes 'right' or he will lose his job," was made by a single member of the Democratic state committee and did not represent the opinion of the other Democrats present.

MOVING FORWARD

NOW THAT the work of building main sewer lines to serve a large portion of the city outside the limit of the old system is well under way, the city commissioners are taking steps to utilize the main system by providing for the lateral districts.

The cost of the laterals will be on the average about \$35 per lot to be served. This cost is nothing compared with the saving over the cost of building cesspools. The fact that property is served by a modern sewer system immediately adds greatly to its value. Because it makes available for residential purposes property that otherwise would not be considered for home building.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force upon and after its passage and publication one week (6 issues) in Las Vegas Age, a daily newspaper published in said City of Las Vegas.

The foregoing ordinance was adopted at a recessed regular meeting of said Board held on the 13th day of April, 1932, as an emergency ordinance, pursuant to a Resolution adopted making same an emergency ordinance upon the vote of the entire Board.
