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MORAL VICTORY

AT LAST the State of Nevada, and Washoe county in particular, have learned that Clark, and running the gauntlet of high-can pit her strength against the upstate groups and get just about what she goes after.

Uncorking a pyrotechnic display, the livest set of fireworks in many a year, Clark county delegates to the republican state convention yesterday managed to rate two delegates and one alternate to the national parley, according to Reno advices.

Other Nevada counties got in line with Clark, and running the gauntlet of high-pressure parliamentary procedure, subdued Washoe with her unreasonable demands.

Strained relations were felt in the state convention at times, but due to the able work of Mark Bradshaw, who conducted the confab, good feeling had been restored among the clashing groups at the time of adjournment.

As was fully expected the group that will represent the Republican party of Nevada at Chicago this summer, was instructed to support President Hoover for the nomination.

Full confidence of the party was also expressed in Senator Tasker L. Oddie and Representative Sam S. Arentz at the meeting.
