to predicting a lot of trouble for his opponents in future battles.

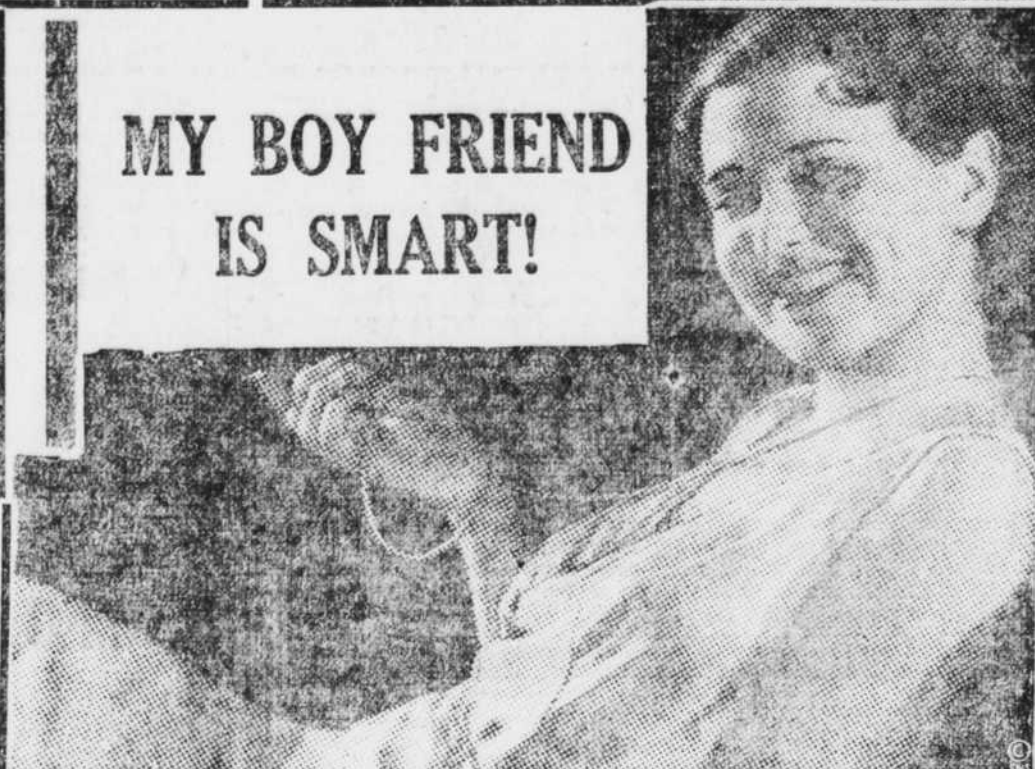
