BURGOO KING COPS GOLD AND GLORY IN FAMED TURF RACE; ECONOMIC, STEPENFETCHIT, 1-2

By GEORGE KIRKSEY United Press Staff Correspondent CHURCHILL DOWNS, LOUISVILLE, Ky., May 7. (UP)—With a driving burst of speed that left nineteen horses struggling weakly in his wake, Burgoo King, bay colt owned by Col. E. R. Bradley, swept to a smashing victory in the Kentucky derby today before a crowd of 45,000.

At the finish, Burgoo King was all by himself. Economic struggled bravely to hold second place from Stepenfetich, ridden by Lavelle and black fedora. His clothes were immaculate though well worn. Glancing neither to the right nor to the left, he walked with dignity to the betting window of Brownfield and said: "Suh, I wager you one hundred dollars that Burgoo King, the gallant horse of that most estimable southern gentleman, Colonel E. R. Bradley, wins the Kentucky derby."
