REDS REPLACE CINDER MEET

PHILLIES ON 3RUNG OF LADDER

NEW YORK, May 9. (AP)—Cincinnati's fast-stepping Reds replaced the Philadelphia Phillies on the third rung of the National League ladder today by nosing them out, 4 to 3.

With the bases filled in the ninth, Well Gilbert singled to drive in the winning Cincinnati run. Ernie Lombardi homered in the seventh for another Reds' run. Cincinnati got off to a running start with two tallies in the second. Ed Holley allowed the Reds seven hits, while Owen Carroll yielded nine but kept them scattered discreetly. Lee homered in the ninth for Philadelphia.

The champion St. Louis Cardinals continued to head the second division by staging a three-run rally in the ninth inning, nosing out Brooklyn, 7 to 6. Sparky Adams tripled in the ninth, with Gelbert on Bottomley on base, tied the score. Then Jack Quinn purposely passed Ernie and Ozell, trying for a double play. But Collins singled to deep center, scoring Adams with the winning run. Cuccinello gave Brooklyn the lead in the second with a homer. Clark and Quinn yielded 13 hits to the Cards, while Flint Rhem allowed 12.

New York at Chicago was washed out.

In the only game played in the American league, Washington's Senators blanked Cleveland, 3 to 0. Wes Ferrell had limited the league Senators to two hits in the first six innings, but he weakened and Washington tallied one run in the seventh and two in the eighth. Lefty Brown held the Indians to four scattered hits, while Ferrell allowed the Senators six. Two of them came in the seventh inning to score the first run, and Carl Reynolds' homer in the eighth, with Cronin on base, accounted for the other two.
