Two types of portable recording equipment was used by the RKO Pathe technicians in getting sounds ranging from stage whispers to booming cannon. One was a midget outfit that weighed only a little more than 400 pounds and which was handled as easily as a camera.

A larger portable outfit was employed for scenes filmed aboard the clipper ship, Indiana, location home of the troupe. The generator was kept on a property barge alongside of the Indiana and a small cabin amidships was fitted up as a recording booth and sound laboratory.
