NUDISTS GET PRISON TERMS

NELSON, B. C. May 13. (UP) - Sentences of three years in prison were imposed here late today on 52 women members of the Sons of Freedom sect of the Doukhobars, who pleaded guilty to parading in the nude near Thrums last Sunday.

Seventy-five men were sentenced to similar terms Thursday. The additions today raised the total of convicted and sentenced convicts to 247. Thirty-nine men and 48 women await trial at Grand Forks. All are expected to plead guilty.

WALTER B. Smith, county attorney of Bell county, was one of the chief witnesses, and summed up his stand after repeated questions from Arthur Garfield Hays of the committee as to whether he would seek to prosecute the group in Nevada.

"If you come down there and violate a law, you'll be put in jail," Smith said. "I'd be as nice to you as I could to a man of your type."
