The day's news in general was not such to inspire much firmness. but there were many people who derived encouragement from noticeable improvement in the oil industry and another rise in wheat prices Oil stocks consequently gave about the best performance of the day under leadership of Standard of New Jersey, which closed more than a point higher at 241/2. Traders who had been cheered by recent developments in the world of petroleum expected further constructive results from the meeting world oil producers, which reported further progress today.

Aside from some cautious statements of optimism by Charles M. Schwab of Bethlehem Steel and William A. Irvin of U. S. Steel, the meeting of the American Iron & Steel Institute today only served to deepen economic gloom.
