PETROLLE SLASHES BAT INTO RIBBONS, GAINING DECISION IN CHI FIGHT

LAST MINUTE BLOWS WIN GAMES

By GEORGE KIRKSEY (United Press Staff Correspondent) CHICAGO STADIUM, May 20. (U.P.)—Billy Petrolle, Duluth, Minn., junior welterweight, methodically cut Christopher (Bat) Battalino of Hartford, Conn., into ribbons for the second time in two months tonight, but he couldn't make the former featherweight champion take a backward step during 10 rounds of the bloodiest battle ever staged in Chicago's arena.

Referee Dave Barry and the two judges unanimously awarded the decision to Petrolle. In sympathy for Battalino, who stood out under a terrific lacing, the crowd yelled for a draw, but there wasn't any doubt about the victor from the sixth round to the finish.

A crowd estimated at 11,000 paid about \$30,000 to see the match which was expected to provide a challenger for Tony Canzoneri's lightweight crown. Both Battalino and Petrolle weighed 140 pounds.

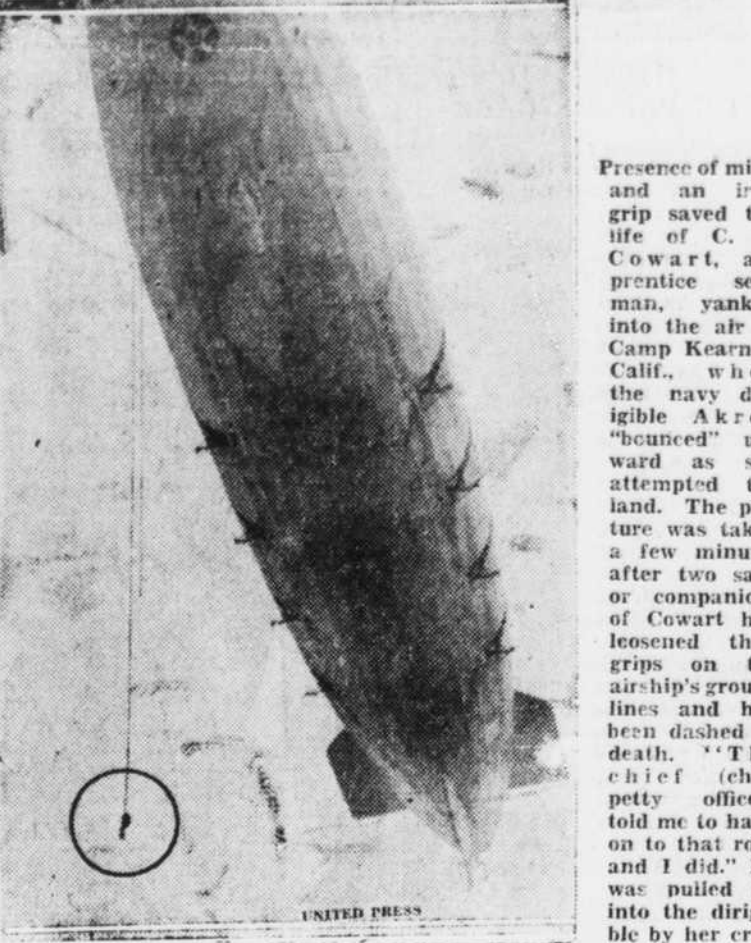
Battalino carried the fight to Petrolle from the first to last punch—never quitting, never backing up although he was cut, lacerated and bleeding almost constantly from the second round until the finish.

In the first round, Battalino dropped Petrolle with a left hook to the face. Petrolle was dazed and started to get up on a short count, but the experience of 113 fights in eight years caused him to look toward his corner where his manager, Jack Hurley, was frantically waving him to stay down. Petrolle stayed on one knee until Referee Barry reached nine, and then he walked to the referee and wiped the resin off his gloves on the official's shirt, getting the benefit of a few extra seconds.

By this time Petrolle had completely recovered from the punch which floored him, and for the rest of the first round, Battalino received his first cut—a split lower lip which spouted blood all the rest of the contest.

In the fourth round, Petrolle opened a gash on Battalino's left temple, up in Bat's bushy black hair, and another over his right eye. From this point on, Battalino's face was covered with blood and gore, but he kept walking right into the withering fire of the Fargo Express' best punches. At times Battalino's aggressiveness forced Petrolle punching all his might to retreat all around the ring. Bat just kept his face in front of Petrolle, seemingly taunting him to hit like a negro behind a canvas curtain in the old carnival sideshow.

QUALIFIERS FOR BIG TEN MEET PUT OHIO FIRST

EVANSTON, Ill., May 20. (U.P.)—Qualifying trials in the 32nd annual Big Ten track and field meet ran true to form today and Michigan, Ohio State and Indiana remained outstanding contenders for the championship which will be decided tomorrow in the finals at Dwyer stadium.

Ohio State, which never has won the title, led in qualifiers, placing 16 men in the finals. Michigan was second with 15, Illinois, Iowa and Indiana tied for third with 12 each. Minnesota came next with 11, followed by Wisconsin 7, Purdue 4, Northwestern and Chicago, 2 each. Trials were held in 11 of the 16 events.

Don Bennett, Ohio State's sophomore sprinter, who is expected to win both the 100 and 200 yard dashes tomorrow, was beaten in the century today when he slowed up at the finish. Hellmich, Illinois, who had the fastest time in the 100-yard dash trials, beat Bennett by a few inches.

Michigan made a clean sweep of the four heats in the 440-yard dash. Russell, Glading, Ellerby and DeBaker are members of the team. The Wolverines' hopes were increased when Jack Campbell, sprinter, who failed to compete during the indoor season, qualified in both dashes.

LONDOS WARNED HE MUST ACCEPT NEW YORK, May 20. (U.P.)—Jim Londos of Greece must accept a title challenge from Dick Shikat of Philadelphia shortly or forfeit his claims to the world heavyweight wrestling championship, the New York athletic commission warned today.

William Muldoon, spokesman for the commission, told Londos' manager, Ed White, and Promoter Jack Curley that if Londos refuses a Shikat match he will discard his previous rulings against Ed "Strangler" Lewis' title claims, and declare the winner of a Lewis-Shikat match the world champion.

SAMMY FULLER STEPS UP TOWARD CANZONERI BY OUTPOINTING BERG

(U.P.)—Sammy Fuller, Boston's chubby lightweight champion contender, advanced in his campaign for a title chance with Tony Canzoneri by decisively outpointing Jack "Kid" Berg of England in a 12-round bout before a crowd of 7,000 in Madison Square Garden tonight.
