DIVERSION TUNNEL EXCAVATION IS COMPLETED SUNDAY MORNING; JOB OF LINING BIG BORES IS PUSHED

(Continued From Page One) portal excavations and approach cuts.

STARTED YEAR AGO Operations were started in May, 1931, and were completed in one year almost to a day.

With all of the tunnel portals now protected by small arch dams, with excavated rock dumped around them, Six Companies, Inc., is engaged in pouring the 3-ft. concrete lining.

On Friday, May 20, 494 men were engaged in the concrete work, with an additional 242 men being employed in form construction and erection, incidental to the lining.

The side wall section of the concrete lining is also progressing in the upper portals of diversion tunnels two and three, it being approximately 6 per cent completed, or a total of 983 feet.

Total 983 8,847 The pouring of the invert section of the lining has proceeded far enough in diversion tunnel No. 4 to permit the erection of the side wall jumbo, used as a form for pouring the concrete.

The final state in the lining—the pouring of the arch section to complete the fifty-foot circle—will be carried out in the upper portal of diversion tunnel No. 3 within the next week.

Within the next 30 days it is estimated that lining operations will be proceeding full blast on all portions of the work, and in all four diversion tunnels.

Six Companies hopes to finish the diversion tunnel lining by October of this year, so that the construction of diversion dams to divert the water through the diversion tunnels may be started during the period of low water, and finished before the flood season of 1933.

Last Sunday night a half dozen Six Companies workmen were sitting on one of the flat bed trucks used to convey supplies and materials into the tunnels.

The noise in the confined space of the tunnels was indeed terrific. Did the gentlemen scatter? Hm! Sworn testimony from a man who witnessed it is to the effect that they had actually bounded off the truck and took a considerable quantity of persuasive argument on the part of their fellow workmen, to convince them that they had not been blown off by an explosion of the dynamite they had been sitting on.

Aside from suffering nerve shock, the boys were reported to be in perfect physical condition and able to resume their work shortly after their harrowing experience. The scene of the incident was in number four tunnel on the Arizona side of the dam.
