LAS VEGAS is a really beautiful little city, even if it is supposed to be a desolate and barren spot in the desert.

Looking south on Second street the view is delightful, the great cottonwood trees forming an arch entirely over the roadway which shuts out the sun all day.

We may have our preferences as to trees, but we must admit that we could spare any or all other varieties better than we could spare the cottonwoods.

Cottonwoods grow with certainty, and they grow quickly. A cottonwood post will send up a tuft of green branches and be giving grateful shade while other varieties of trees are just deciding whether it is worth while to live or not.

Cottonwood trees changed Las Vegas in five years from a forbidding, hot, desolate and unhappy place to live summers, to a charming little city with lawns and shade. From a camp on the desert to a city of pleasant homes.

The cottonwood is not perfect and it has some disadvantages, but it does more for such places as Las Vegas than all other trees put together.

Why a city? THE AGE was asked yesterday what reason there is to suppose Las Vegas will increase in population and wealth.

The question has been asked many times and often answered by The Age to the best of our ability and judgment.

In the first place we must assume that the world is not coming to an end just now, nor is the human race to lose its energy, ambition and desire for the good things of life.
