WALKER READY FOR BATTLE WITH BIG BASQUE

NEW YORK, May 25—(U.P.)—Mickey Walker, the over-stuffed middleweight who forced the customers to take his heavy-weight ambitions seriously by going fifteen rounds to a draw with that terrible Sharkey man, squares off with Paulino Uzcudun in the feature ten-rounder at Madison Square Garden tomorrow night.

The bout, so far as anyone has been able to figure out, was made solely for the purpose of keeping Walker's hand out of the title shot he and Jack Kearns are so certain the pugilistic little Irishman will get this year of the next. Certainly Walker has little to gain in the way of prestige by whipping Paulino. For the Basque Woodchopper, never a great fighter at his best, isn't even an ordinary one now.

Paulino's chief claims to fame are the most magnificent set of gold teeth this side of Singapore and a record of never having been knocked out. But he has been outpointed decisively dozens of times. Johnny Risko, Truffy Griffiths, George Cook and Primo Carnera are a few of the boys who have whittled the Basque Woodchopper.

So it would seem that Walker must knock Paulino kicking to gain anything save a few thousand dollars from the match. That he will do this is by no means certain. In the first place Mickey, according to the statistical chart of the two men, will spot his man 28 pounds in weight, and a number of inches in reach. Secondly, Paulino, old and battle worn as he is, still is a tough old bird, with a hide like iron.

Furthermore, that crumpling stance of his, in which he covers up everything but the crown of his head, makes it pretty tough for his opponent to land anything in the way of solid blows. Paulino's weight advantage will make it dangerous for Walker, brave as he is, to wade in close and try to break through the armor.

On the other hand, no one can see Walker losing. Paulino's attack consists chiefly of a right hand swing that starts so far back and takes so long to land, that Mickey will have to be very sound asleep indeed, to be hit by it. If it should land, however, there may be an upset. Harry Wills caught one of Paulino's swings at Ebbets field one night, and left the ring feet first. Paulino started it from deep center field and everybody said it coming but Wills.

Despite the magnificent unimportance of the bout, it is likely to draw a fairly good house. For with the possible exception of Sharkey and Billy Petrolle, Walker is about the best drawing card in the business.
